The reason for all this pleading (and I can be a rotten pleader at times) is, I have responded to a request from the organisers of the Bristol Classic Car Show, to provide a stand. A reply has been sent back requesting space for four vehicles, and can confirm that we have been booked in. The date is .. 23/24th March .. and the Show has a feature on Rover, so lots of effort, please.

REGALIA

I have been mouned and grouned at, for some time, about this so we have taken the plunge. Badges are being prepared for windscreens and should be with us in the middle of January. Same design as that which appears on the Newsletter, but in yellow and black. Price is .. £1.50 each. Details from me on Tadley 5194.

Now that towing time has arrived, it's worthwhile having a look at the towing/towed arrangements on the Landie and Rangie. Those towhooks, towballs and lifting rings which are for cosmetic purpose will undoubtedly be the first thing that someone else will try to use as an attachment point, so it's a good idea to get some proper nuts and bolts and fix them on properly, or else removing them.

For those who don't have a tow point on the front of the Landie no problem unless you have a capstan winch fitting through the front cross member (then you won't have problems with a winch fitted in any case!). Pass the tow rope under the front bumper (making sure that it's over the steering track and drag arms), and pass the rope through the hole in the front cross member. It's easier if the rope has an eye spliced at the end, as a shackle can then be put through the eye and round the rope. If it's just a plain rope then a bowline or slipped half hitch can be used. For those with non military Landies the pto hole in the rear cross member is a useful towing point. Both these front and rear points are better than using the spring shackles which have sharp edges and can cut the rope and also jam it. If you are being towed(it happens to most of us!) via front cross member, then make sure you don't get the front wheels over the tow rope or you'll find out very quickly how track and drag rods get bends in them!

Yet another wet journey south to Petersfield on 2nd December, where 9 Landies and 1 Rangie met at the railway station for our most memorable day out green roading in the mud. A short drive up the A3 then into the woods. The strange lurching of Alan's Rangie on a narrow downhill track over some rather large roots, showed that the rear of a Rangie sticks out a bit more than a Landie. I prefer the convex rather than the concave panels. Mike's V8 Lightweight with a new radiator(after the Devil's Highway) decided to melt a petrol pipe but piping and hose clips appeared from various tool boxes to repair the damage and we were soon off again. At about 1145 it seemed that we were driving about on metalled roads waiting for the hestelry to open but no, we were off to THE mud section. Roy's attempt to see how deep a pond was heralded the start of double tows. The mud we found on the track gave virtually no traction and the main problem being the axles and chasses ended up resting in the mud. Not only had opening time con but closing time went and the 10 vehicles had progressed all of 200 yards. A stream in a gully was eventually negotiated by Mike with the aid of muscle power pushing. Much towing and pushing was needed to get the vehicles through, and darkness arrived before we got onto terra slightly firma at about 6.30, having broken 2 tow ropes, double towed at the end of 25 yard tow ropes, got very wet and muddy and travelled mile in 6 hours. It's amazing that a Landie that can't be towed out of mud can be physically pushed. It was good to see everyone working very hard together, so that the Rovers wouldn't have to stay until Spring!

For those of you who got Company cars for Christmas, you may not appreciate that they are able to do things that privately owned cars are not able to do, and that they are also constructed slightly differently.

They can go much faster in all gears, reverse especially, and have much better acceleration and require a shorter braking distance, with a much tighter turning circle and able to drive over ramps at twice the normal speed.

Oil, battery and water levels, and tyre pressures very rarely need checking, and can be driven for 150 miles with the oil pressure warning light on. The suspension is heavy duty to allow paving slabs and building materials to be carried, whilst the tyres are designed to let you drive over kerbs without damage.

They don't need to be kept in a garage at night and can be left unlocked. with ignition keys left in at all other times. Sudden and unexpected engine noises can be eliminated by adjusting the volume of the fitted stereo.
