




Late News

Han Lane Trial

On the February 21st the Hants & Berks Rover Owners held its first RIV of 88 at Ham Lane, near Petersfield. I decided to go down in "Wow", my Ser2 SVB, so the weekend before the preparation started with a quick spin up the road to make sure it would make it, as it had only be used once since Christmas, and an even quicker check to make sure it would pass scrutingering.

On Vednesday I took it into work in order to swop the wheels over. It will become apparent that wheel swoping plays a fairly major part in my Land Rovering as I own two sets of wheels, one fitted with "Teflon Special" road tyres (Goodyear Hi Milers) and the other with Goodyear Xtra Grip cross country tyres. Those who have experience of Xtra Grips will know they have two major faults when used on the road, firstly they are very noisey and secondly they wear remarkably fast. I suspect that they don't do too much for the fuel consumption, but when you are used to 45-50 miles from a gallon of Diesel, the difference between 14 and 15 miles to a gallon of petrol seems insignificant! To get back to the plot lunch time saw me in the carpark putting on the road tyres, 300 miles in a 29 year old Ser2 is bad enough without the tyre howl, to be greeted on my entry to the Sports & Social by a rousing Chorus of "You can't do better that a Quikfit Pitter".

I eventually got away at eight on Saturday morning, not as early as I had hoped, but intime to reach the Fox by two, much to Scotty's disgust, he is beginning to wonder if I have actually moved yet!

Soon I was down in Eastleigh where I was staying with Roy Micheal, with enough time to change the wheels again before it got dark. Roy is the current holder of the Red Leader Shield so I was hoping some of his luck may rub off, although anyone who has seen him an action, trialing or greenroading, will know that very little luck is involved.

The following day dawned bright and dry and we soon arrived at Ham Lane, to find a minor crisis had taken place. Cierk of the Course Richard Stewart, together with his band of helpers, had laid the sections out on the previous day, but had arrived at the site, which is mainly used for motorcycle srambles, to find that someone had kindly removed all the canes and stacked

them all in a neat pile! However by the time every one was signed on and scrutineered the eight sections had been laid out again. The Ham Lane site can be split into three areas, the top, really only suitable for the paddock, the lower grassy bit and below that the muddy crater. Four sections had been put on the grass and four more in the crater.

The trial had attracted about 20 entries. The majority were Land Rovers, including several V8s, but the entry included several Rangies, including a Vogue and a few specials, including a Range Rover based out and out Comp Safari racer (fully road legal) and "That Range Rover" of 4x4 fame. We split into two groups, our group included a mix of standard Landies and the specials. We went into the crater first where the sections gave a definate advantage to the specials, and by the second section my score was into double figures. The morning was interesting, but not too succesful. The afternoon found us back on the grass where the sections were more to my liking, i.e. easy. This didn't stop a couple of the "experts" coming a cropper on section one by attempting the section with the brain in nuetral (some unkind person suggested I spent the whole day in that state!).

Discretion suggests I draw a veil over the actual results, lets just say no one was more surprised than I was.

On leaving the site it was soon obvious that all was not well. Yow would only go on 3 cylinders, and then only with the choke out. I struggled on for a few miles flat out at 40 mph for a few miles till I reached the meeting point and was able to have a look. I replaced the wayeward plug lead but still all was not well although we struggled back to Eastleigh, with just enough light left to attack the carb jets before calling it a day.

Monday morning saw me changing the wheels over and cleaning the plugs prior to the long trek home and by mid afternoon I was back in Colwyn Bay. It would noy be quite true to say that Wow had never missed a beat in 600 miles, but it had certainly done well with no major problems. All that was left was too change the wheels ready for a North Vales Land Rover Club trial the following weekend.



PLEASE NOTE

The last trial in February was OVERSUBSCRIBED and it was only the non-attendance of some competitors that made it possible for those members who turned up "on spec" on the day to participate. There will be 5 classes.

Class 2 : As class 1, but using any other engine.

Class 3: As class 1, but wheelbase more than 93".

Class 4: As class 2, but wheelbase more than 93".

Class 5 : Special class,for non-Rover vehicles or
for home built "specials".

Classes may be amalgamated or divided at the discretion of the organisers.

Marshals will be required to assist with the running of the event, so, if you want to assist, or haven't taken part in a vehicle trial yet (and marshalling is a good opportunity to see what goes on) and want to help the club, then contact the Secretary of the Meeting.
