
EDITORIAL....

POWER STEERING FOR EARLY RANGIES

Roger asked if I would be prepared to enlarge on the very brief notice that I had modified a Rover P5 power steering box to fit my Rangie, so he is to blame for this article!


First it is necessary to obtain from a P5B: power steering box, pump, hydraulic fluid reservoir, hoses and all the nuts and bolts associated with these parts. I paid £40 for this lot. As the car was running I was able to test the operation of the steering first.

The Rangie parts required are mainly to mount the pump on the cylinder head, low on the timing cover on the engine.


The following parts are also needed:

Brackets numbered: 90610796, 603972, 90611439, 611440, 611213, plus pulley 611379, bearing plate 611212, stud 610789, spacer 611215, engine lifting bracket 90611812, plus countersunk screw 610838. The "manual steering" engine lifting bracket stops the pump belt being adjusted. These parts cost me approximately £40 new from a main dealer.

Removing the old steering arm from the saloon steering box proved to be impossible, so I had to cut it off with an angle grinder. The manual drop-arm from the Rangie fits straight on.



With the old box off the Rangie, drill an 11 mm dia hole through the chassis, using sketch 1 for dimensions. Mark and drill from BOTH sides of the chassis, in case you drill out of square. You then have two mounting points. The third mounting point requires the construction of a bracket on the chassis top, this will have to be welded and can be positioned when the steering box is held in place by the two fixings. Build this bracket around the top mounting of the box. When the box is in place it will be obvious what is required. Disconnect the battery when welding on the car. The P5B steering box obviously does not have provision for the Rangie tie bar. Make a plate to sketch 2, this utilises two of the original steering box mounting holes, plus the additional new one, thus restoring rigidity to the panhard rod mounting bracket. The thickness is made up to the original Rangie thickness of 18 mm by welding (if needed) a washer as shown.On full right lock, the drop arm ball joint will probably hit this mounting bracket, mark where it hits then cut a notch to give clearance. Weld a shaped stiffener to the mounting bracket to compensate for this notch. This bracket is made from mild steel, so there should be no welding problems.

Add the sentence: "However, small amounts of cash may be retained by the Treasurer for Petty Cash, provided that the amount does not exceed 10% of the club funds or £100, whichever is less."

ITEM 5: Rule 12 to be amended:

1st line, amend the word "application" to "applications"

2nd line, after the word "committee", insert a full stop, delete "by the secretary" and add the following: "The applications shall be accompanied by the appropriate subscriptions, which will be returned if an application is rejected"

4th line, delete the sentence beginning "The name and address." 8th line, delete the sentence beginning "Membership of the.." 12th line, add the sentence: "Applicants for ordinary membership

will, after election, become Ordinary Members."

ITEM 6: Rule 13 to be deleted and substituted by a new rule 13: "13. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS: an Associate Member is one who is:

a) A close relative of an ordinary member.

or b) Permanently residing at the same address as an ordinary member.

or c) Accepted as a special case by the committee. Associate Members may participate in club events, they have no voting right and other than notice of renewal of membership, will normally receive no official correspondence."

ITEM 7: Rule 14 to be amended:

2nd line, delete the words: "by the secretary"

Add the following sentence: "Provisional members may participate in club events but have no voting rights."

ITEM 8: Rule 15 to be amended:

1st line, change the word: "OF" to "BY", and after the word "each" insert the word "committee"

3rd line, insert the word "committee" between "any" and "member"

4th line, Delete the sentence beginning "No collective.." and replace with the following sentences: "No collective voting shall be allowed. Proxy voting shall be accepted."

ITEM 9: Rule 17 to be amended:

1st line, insert the word "whole" between the words "twelve" and "months"

2nd line, delete the full stop and add: "however, Associate Membership shall be coincident with the relevant Ordinary Member."

ITEM 11: Rules 14 to 17 inclusive to be renumbered Rules 15 to 18 inclusive.

ITEM 12: A New Rule 14 to be inserted:

"14. SOCIAL MEMBERS: Social members may attend club meetings and participate in club events as passengers, they have no voting rights and other than notice of renewal of membership, will normally receive no official correspondence. They must be personally known to an ordinary member of the club."

ITEM 13: Rule 19 to be amended:

2nd line, delete the words "within two clear months of" and replace them with the word "by" $\,$

3rd line, delete the words "by the Secretary or Treasurer"

7th line, add a full stop after the word "club"

"32. COPIES OF CONSTITUTION: Every member shall be furnished with a copy of the club constitution on election."

ITEM 23: Rule 33 to be amended:

After the words "badges" add the words "of office"

NOTES:

Items 1,5,6,7,9,10,12,13,14 and 15 refer to the classes of membership, applications for and the periods of membership. These are only intended to "tidy up" the membership side of the constitution.

Items 2,3,4,8 and 23 refer to the committee, its election and its running.

Items 16,17,18,19,20 and 21 refer to Annual and Special General Meetings and their requirements.


Other items are intended to "tidy up" the constitution which has over the years been amended, but the alterations have unfortunately resulted in a rather untidy and "bitty" constitution.

I mounted the hydraulic fluid reservoir in the spare battery position, the hoses are just the right length. The reservoir to steering box hose is clipped to the rear of the front chassis cross member.

You will now need to drive the pump so a belt (Rangie part number 614106) will help! I thought that the Rangie crankshaft pulley cost too much, so I cut and welded the original Rangie one to the P5B one. They are not a direct swap because of the different mounting of the pump on the engine.

All that is left is to connect the steering box to the steering column. The Rangie steering universal joints match the P5B box, but the P5B steering box shaft needs a couple of modifications, cut 6 mm off the length and with the same angle grinder carefully enlarge the universal-joint clamp-bolt groove to take a 5/16 inch bolt.

The steering shaft required is longer than the original so one now needs to be fabricated. I had spent a lot of time looking round scrap yards trying to find a shaft that would fit, but of course I didn't succeed, but I did notice that Volvo solved a similar problem by welded bar, so if it's good enough for Volvo, it's good enough for me! Cut 60 mm off the ends of the old Rangie shaft (the splined section) For the extension shaft I used an old Landie drag link rod, these are of good quality steel. Cut a piece 140 mm long (after removing the internally threaded end) and in a lathe bore out to a depth of 30 mm, a hole whose diameter just allows the cut-off pieces of Rangie shaft to fit. With the two clamping bolt grooves lined up at 200 mm centres, weld with low hydrogen rods or MIG, NOT the low amp diy sets that one can buy cheaply. This weld MUST be done properly, your life and others depends on it, so, if you are not completely confident, get it done by a professional, it won't cost very much, but it will be worth it. I recently had the Rangie MOT tested by a Land Rover garage and they were quite happy with the modifications. I have competed in three RTV's with success, not in terms of driving results, but with the steering standing up to the rough conditions!! AND my wife can now get out of Tesco's car park with ease!

....and now to a long letter from the Scottish Land-Rover Owners Club.

61, Wallace Street Stirling FK8 1NX Scotland

Fellow A.R.C. Members,

There has been much talk of late regarding 'Green lanes'. This has led to an increase in requests for information about same. This in turn, has created other problems for us up here in Haggisland, such as the attempted closure of the Corrie Yairrack Pass. This has given the impetus to research the legal position, which is confusing to say the least, and far too complicated to try and explain in a letter. The following is a resume of the position:—

If there is a track with no obstacles which leads from one public place to another public place with no obstructions and a 'clear' entrance and exit (i.e. no verges to be crossed). [Editor's note:- that's how it reads! There must be no restrictions on passage, and the use must be open, peaceable and there must be no interdict against your use of the track. If the above conditions apply, then you may be free to use the track, you should not ask permission, as this could be used to negate the argument for a right of way. In driving such a track which is not a right of way. you may not be breaking any laws, but at the same time you do not have a right of way. If however the track leads to a dead end or forms a loop, with the same entrance and exit, you may not drive there without permission. The big problem is that all this has to assume that the driver of a motor vehicle has the same basic rights in Scot's Law as a pedestrian. a horserider, or a carriage driver, and this assumption has yet to be proven or disproven in court, Got that?

In order to prove R.o.W. on any of these tracks we have to show 20 years of use, as described above, so please, please help by sending

evidence of use of any such track in Scotland which you may have used, a letter is enough, but a survey form would be better. In particular we need evidence for the Corrie Yarrack, the Lairig Moire, and any of the other military roads, plus any others you may have used. On this point, please, you MUST NOT ask West Highland Estates for permission to drive Corrie Yairrack, as they want to close it down.

The second area where help is required is for members wishing to drive in England, it is well nigh impossible to deal with local authorities at such a remote distance (150 Miles of A roads at best), for confirmation of status of tracks. Would it be possible for members of one club to contact the Rights of Way Officer of the club in whose area he is visiting for confirmation of status of roads? It makes sense, and after all, co-operation and liaison are what the A.R.C. is all about, isn't it?

Any information will be much appreciated, if sent to myself at the address above.
