

## **Green Lane News**

The observant among you will have noticed that there hasn't been much news on this front for a while. I have now received more draft definitive maps of Berkshire; 79 so far; very nearly making a full set. These are to 1:10000 scale. Each 1:25000 scale Pathfinder map is made up of two 10km squares so you can see how many of these maps cover the county! Each 10km square is divided into four 5km squares called NW, NE, SW and SE. The maps are listed below. If you have any queries or would just like to have a look to see what a definitive map looks like, give me a call and I'll bring them to the club meeting.

If you find any errors on these maps, please let me know as our use of them will be a kind of "Proof reading".

You may recall our trip during last Summer when we passed by Coombe Gibbet near Inkpen. These maps clearly reiterate our right to open the gate marked "PRIVATE" and drive across the fields to the south of the gravel track that everyone else there was using illegally! Strictly speaking, even the gate shouldn't be there; but as long as it isn't locked then no objections will be raised.

As many of you will know for the past couple of years the North Wales Land Rover Club has held a camping weekend and trial over Easter at Arenig, near Bala, to which the Hants & Berks Rover Owners have been invited. (It is worth reminding you that, as ARC Club members, you will be welcome at most NWLRC events, but particularly so at Easter.)

If you have read Colin's reports you will have realised that Arenig is a fantastic trials site, but as a campsite it leaves a bit to be desired! In addition it is in the National Park, and we have had several visits from the warden. He has assured us that in his official capacity he will defend our right to use the site, but his personal view is that motor sport has no place in the National Park. To add to our problems it transpired that a large part of the site was a Site of Scientific Interest, although the Nature Conservancy Council had omitted top tell the Landowner! After a meeting we have come to a compromise, but feel it would be best not to use the site for our premier event.

In the nick of time however we have found another site, courtesy of Landcraft, a few miles away the other side of Bala. Although not quite as rugged as Arenig this is still a massive, and promising, site (you may have seen it featured in some of the national magazines after NORC's safari there), but with slightly less spartan camping. It is still pretty basic, with a marked lack of facilities, and I suspect it will also catch the wind, but it shouldn't be muddy, and the campers should be able to bang pegs in.

Another change for 91 is that it is to be a joint event with the Range Rover Register, hopefully this will not cramp the NWLRC's social style too much! What we hope it will mean is that we will be able to put on two competitions over the course of the weekend, probably a trial and a gymkhana, but the details still have to be decided.

The reason for writing this now is to extend a warm welcome to all Hants & Berks Rover Owners to come and spend Easter, March 29th to April 1st,in Wales and enjoy a pleasant weekend, in beautiful country, in the company of other Land & Range Rover enthusiasts, with a bit of competition included. Put the date in your diary now, And don't be put off by the fact that it finishes on All Fools Day! Barbecues in a blizzard have to be experienced to be believed.

# Bonfire Meet 90. Nick Woodage.

## **ARC News**

The meeting of the 24th of November was turbulent as ever. Only myself and Steve Barnwell attended from the HBRO. Here are some of the main topics of conversation:-

Following the refusal by the council to ratify the change voted on earlier in the year, there was some discussion on the new "Executive council" The refusal to ratify is actually constitutional; I pointed out that as

this was the first time this had been done, it shouldn't have been hidden by clever wording in the minutes. Dicky Day also comments on this in Rover Runes. The Midland Club, who's proposal it was in the first place, made no comment, so I assume they agree with this undemocratic behaviour!

Representatives from the Cumbrian Club finally responded to the criticism of the rule breaking at the RTV they ran on the War of the Roses weekend. They claimed that pressures and organisational difficulties were the main causes and they apologised for the shortcomings. The general vote was to accept the statement. The view was that the point has been made and that clubs are now being censured for their wrongdoings (as indeed the HBRO was a couple of years ago) The trouble is that many clubs are still blatantly disregarding the rules!

The Pennine Club recently co-promoted with (or did they invite to participate?) a non-ARC club. Either way this is against the rules; so they will now have to do what CROC did, come to the next meeting and explain away the reasons. .....and so it will go on and on until stern action is taken.

The Lode Lane factory will re-open for tours on Tuesdays and Wednesdays in 1991. Details later.

Are you restoring an old vehicle that has been off the road for a long time? It MAY be possible to re-use the registration number by special arrangement with the RAC.

Overseas Liaison Officer:- Dave Jenden may soon be taking over from Bill King. Clubs have been asked to send copies of their magazines to the OLO so he can forward any relevant articles of interest to overseas clubs.

Rule Changes for voting at next AGM:-

- a) CCVT: Roll bars to be mandated for all vehicles.
- b) Engine position to be defined for Specials.
- c) 90/110 style fronts for 88" Srs IIs & IIIs.

Also to be voted on is the proposal that any clubs breaking the rules will have to explain the reasons at the following ARC meeting. If the explanation is not satisfactory to the majority, then expulsion may be called for.

1991 AGM will be on 16th March.



## **GREEN LANE TRIP**

11/11/90 by Gary. Green

The meet for this Sundays Green Lane Trip was at Hook station (O.S. 726539 Sheet 186) and 6 intrepid drivers turned up to tackle the Green Lanes of Hampshire. All the vehicles were Land Rovers and all SWB's apart from Nick Jennings' who was driving his new (A-Reg) LWB painted in bright orange.

We set off shortly after 10.00am towards the Dentist's. (For those who are not too familiar with the Green Lanes of Hampshire, this is the name of the rather notorious RUPP which has large "Cavities", hence the name). Nick took the lead in his LWB followed by myself and the others. Mike followed up the rear in his grey 1959 SWB as he was the only other driver with a CB rig. I also had a CB rig so the two of us could communicate if there were any problems. Ashley in his V8 Lightweight had a CB rig also but because he had been supplied the wrong plug by Tandy couldn't connect up his aerial. But with the racket his vehicle makes inside it wouldn't have made any difference anyway.

After driving down the A30 towards Basingstoke for a short while we turned left into the RUPP and past a rather makeshift "ROAD CLOSED" sign by the side of the road. Ignoring this we continued further until we came to another "ROAD CLOSED" sign across the RUPP. We all parked up and went for a walk down the lane to see what the problem was. We passed some lovely big holes and further down the there was a tree across the RUPP with no way of passing. Everyone reversed up and drove back to the A30. As we rejoined the A30 there was a notice posted on the side of the road which said that the RUPP had been temporarily closed. If anyone wants an idea as to what to buy Nick Jennings for Christmas I suggest a pair of glasses.

The next RUPP's we negotiated were not very difficult at all and in spite of the recent rain were comparatively dry. We drove to the Five-Lanes in a southerly direction and eventually found some mud in the "Wet Forest" (Herriard Common) where we had our first bog down of the day. Nothing too bad. Terry got stuck in his green Series three SWB, but he just reversed back and managed to get through the second time.

We stopped for lunch at a small pub called the Yew Tree, at Lower Wield, which didn't do food on a Sunday apart from a full sit down Sunday Roast. They were fully booked up for this as well. Will all Green Laners please note, this is not a good pub to stop at. Neither is the one down the road in Preston Candover. They wanted us to wait an hour. But the pub in Axford was good, quick service, good food and good beer.

Back to the green laning. After lunch we decided to tackle the RUPP west from Upper Wield. This time it was Nick who got stuck. Those XCL's certainly didn't do much good for Nick. It was noticeable that all the green lanes we drove didn't look as if they had been driven for some time.

We continued working our way back up towards south Basingstoke and about 4.00pm we finished in a layby on the A339 Ref. 653486 Sheet 185. It was now getting dark and everyone apart from Nick decided to do one more Green Lane on the way back. It was decided to go back along the Five Ways RUPP along the section we hadn't done. Ashley took the lead in his lightweight with his brother map reading. Ashley's windscreen was covered in thick mud which his Super-All-Traction tyres had thrown up in the Wet Forest which may have had something to do with the fact that we drove down lots of country lanes and what appeared to be a RUPP turned out to be a farmer's field which we nearly strayed into. We didn't find the Five Ways RUPP! Come back Nick all is forgiven!

At Odiham we all went separate ways after a very fine day out. The only question still unanswered is whether Nick really has a petrol or diesel engine in his Land Rover, or did he pour oil down the wrong hole?
