
The competitions are not actually run to ARC regulations but the AROC's rules are very close to ARC ones. Membership cards and vehicle documentation will be required.

How to get there: (Map ref 152/SP863494)

Junction 14 on M1; take A509 to Newport Pagnell; turn right onto B526 to Northampton; go through Lathbury and Gayhurst; after ¼ mile turn right to Weston Underwood; after 1½ miles, Church Farm is on the right just before Weston Underwood. Alternatively, stay on the A509 to Olney and turn left through Weston Underwood and Church Farm will be on the left ½ mile beyond the village. OS map shows this as "Woolwich Barn".



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# **ARC Vehicle Regs**

I have mentioned before that the Vehicle Regulations in the ARC yearbooks you all have are now out of date so I have produced a booklet containing the new set. Some of you may already have one. The current issue is green and has two vehicles and 1992 on the front. The older purple ones are still OK to use but all others are now out of date. Please bear in mind the Roll-bar rules and the Scrutineering article in the ARC Yearbook are still valid. Members of the committee will endeavour to hand these new rule books out to regular competitors at events or club evenings. Please write to me or phone if you want me to send you one. Remember too, that the rulings in the RAC Yearbook also apply to us.

Note that some of the rules have just been changed again. ALL the changes will allow currently prohibited vehicles to compete, so that is all good news.

Note too that rules a) and d) in my ARC AGM article are now subject to an ARC SR (Supplementary Regulation) which allows them to be implemented straight away. This is because the changes were made to correct badly written or unworkable rules.

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
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# RTV & CCV Trial Brick Kiln farm, Alton, April 5th

Scrutineering will be at 9:00.a.m. and the competition will start at 10:00.a.m. prompt, so please be on time. ARC rules will apply as usual. The rules in your ARC Yearbooks are now out of date; revised sets of rules are available now. Contact Steve Kirby for your new rule book. Don't forget your MOT certificates and driving licences. RTV will be a qualifying round for the "Red Leader Shield" and the "Pilot Trophy".

Please come along on Saturday to help lay out. On the Sunday, please enrol as a marshal once in a while, we'll show you how to score if you've not done it before!



#### **ARC AGM 1992**

The usual trio of HBRO representatives trekked North to Solihull for the 1992 ARC AGM. In my usual fashion I will endeavour to provide some notes on the highlights of this event with as little bias as possible!!

Matters Arising from the previous meeting:-

There is still grave concern over the grey area regarding the fact that there is no minimum age for marshals. The RAC have now accepted proposals from the ARC relating to age, supervision, parental guidance etc.

Copies of the 1992 ARC rules have been sent by Steve Kirby (that's me folks) to all ARC club secretaries.

Regarding the obtaining of permits, can the ARC become an exempt organisation? The answer actually is yes, and the RAC would no longer be in control of what we did but we would have to set up a whole regulatory and judicial organisation. This would cost thousands and take a long time; that's why there are so few of them!

The Land Rover name is a registered trade mark. Should the ARC participate in the maintaining the exclusive use of this name to those approved by LR ltd.

#### Chairman's Report.

Peter Oakden started by saying that "It seems Tony Holder knew what he was doing when he stood down last year!"

Regarding the National rally, he said that the 1991 event was highly successful despite certain amounts of aggravation beforehand. He pointed out that Rover Clubs are for Rover enthusiasts but that too much time was being spent on competition matters leaving no time for Saloon car issues. He also expressed annoyance that some of the nationally published four wheel drive magazines listed the ARC and its member clubs as "Off-road" clubs. Following the disappearance of LRP and their sponsorship, the members clubs may have to provide finance for the running of the ARC.

It is clear from comments made at events that the rank-and-file membership know little of the ARC. Delegates to the quarterly meetings should inform their membership of what it's all about. (I think I've been doing that; if you need more info, please let me know.)

Regarding the National Rally this year, he pointed out that the radical approach being used this time was a means to an end and would not become the norm. Finally, he expressed hope that the 1993 event would be safe from this year's problems.

#### Secretary's Report.

The registered office address has now changed to that of Andy Stavordale. He thanked those for completing the questionnaire (Only 28 so far from HBRO members as of March 14th.) He also expressed great disappointment and surprise that most club newsletters failed to print even the dates of ARC meetings, let alone reports of same. One club's representative stated here that their newsletter editor refused to publish anything at all from Rover Runes, the newsletter of the ARC. So much for communications!

Andy also asked for any changes of club officers to be reported to him as he does endeavour to keep up to date lists.

#### Correspondence

An assortment of letters and comments were read out. Notable was a request from a dealer in Chicago who wants to buy pre-1968 Land Rovers for shipping to the USA. No 6-cylinder jobs and preferably no diesels. He will handle ALL aspects of the deal and pay in sterling.

#### Treasurer's Report

A written report was submitted. Let me know if you want to see it.

#### Caravan Officer's Report

Jim Campbell said that about 100 camping permits had been issued last year to 18 clubs. (We had two, it seems.) If we don't take out a permit and the local council find out, not only can HBRO be prosecuted and the event would be cancelled forthwith but the ARC could lose its exemption permit. (Exemption is for planning permission.) ARC is an ACCEO (Association of Camping and Caravanning Exempt Organisations) member. ACCEO arrange public and private liability insurance among other things. The permit for an event should be on display at all times. If we have non-HBRO members as guests, we should arrange some kind of temporary membership for the duration. As of Jan. 1 1992, a permit costs £2.

#### Rights of Way.

A written report was submitted and will be available later. The TRO on the Ridgeway in Berkshire is not in force yet and this can still be driven subject to the current Code of Conduct. Any club arranging a competition in or within 2km of an SSSI (a Site of Special Scientific Interest) must get planning permission from the local council.

#### Press Publicity and Sponsorship

Dave Barker thanked all those who filled in the questionnaire. Basically he will use it to analyse the types and quantities of vehicles in use so he can more accurately target sponsorship and publicity deals. For instance, dealers are much more likely to want to sponsor RTV events with current vehicles than comp safaris or CCVT events in which discontinued models predominate.

On the subject of the ARC yearbook, this is still as yet still-born. Steve Kirby (it's that man again) offered to produce a working prototype so we can get a better idea as to what it should contain. This is in case suitable sponsorship does appear and we can get on with it more quickly.

#### **RACMSA** Representative.

Dicky Day stated that again he had been voted by the RAC to be the Chairman of the RAC Cross Country Sub-Committee. This is quite a coup for the ARC. Main concerns from the RAC at the moment are:-

Noise - The RAC are likely to be coming down quite heavily on noise matters in the near future.

Tailgates - ARC rules say you can leave them off but RAC regs state that they must be in place. Application has been made to the RAC for the ARC to make them optional. This is being considered and stands every chance of being accepted. So the ARC rule can be left to stand for the time being as it is "under discussion".

Definition of an Off-Road vehicle - Recently, stage rallies have been run on a Comp Safari permit because it's much cheaper. Needless to say the RAC don't like this and they are about to define an off-road vehicle (presumably in such a way that rally cars are not included.) On the subject of Comp safari vehicles, the RAC will soon mandate the fitting of rear warning lights to these vehicles. That almost certainly will affect us too. Still on Comp Safaris, the current speeds are far too high; perhaps we should have a new class for "racing" (Note that no ARC event is

officially a "race" so please don't call any of them that, not even timed events.) A comp Safari is set out in such a way that the maximum speed envisaged will be no more than 70mph at any point or exceed an average of 40 mph.

Permits. Anyone applying for a permit at very short notice should phone the MSA to explain why and apologise in advance for any inconvenience. This will help avoid a fine for late application which the MSA is entitled to impose. A meeting with lan Davis (RACMSA Competitions Department Manager) for ARC Competition Secretaries and Scrutineers (and indeed any other particularly interested parties) will be held at Solihull on June 27th (probably!). This is as a result of a generous offer on the part of this senior official of our governing body.

#### Scrutineering.

Steve Barnwell suggested that club scrutineers look at any National Rally entries before they go, in order to reduce the likelihood of any problems or arguments arising at the National Rally itself.

It might be logical to put in at this point the results of the rule changes. Amazingly all but one of the proposals was accepted, only one NOT being totally unanimous. These come into force on Jan. 1 1993. Very briefly they are:-

- a) Tyre width rule now replaced by the 100mm wheel offset rule (8). So you will be allowed to use those wide tyres you've been using illegally all this time!
- b) RTV vehicles with hard tops must have the whole of the hard top and also have all glass fitted.
- c) Wide springs can be fitted to Series One vehicles. You've always been allowed to do this but now it's in writing.
- d) FC101s are now legal. i.e. 2 leaves on the springs now permitted for these vehicles only.
- e) Ninety style front ends are now permitted. (At last)
- f) On Comp Safari and Team recovery vehicles, the electrical isolation switch can be where you want it so long as the **Triggering system** is:
  - i) On the main hoop of an open vehicle,
  - ii) Outside the cab of a closed vehicle. i.e. front or rear of it. (so get your bowden cables out chaps!)
- g) Mid engined vehicles are legal again!!!
- h) The only failure locking diffs must not be fitted, even if disabled.

#### National Rally 1992

Land owner wants £1700 for the camp site - seems reasonable. It's at Cannock near Birmingham if you haven't been watching. There will be a special meeting on April 4th to visit the site. Want to go?

#### National Rally 1993.

All set for Eastnor and run by the Midlands club.

#### National rally 1994

Peak and Dukeries are well advanced in looking into this. Site may be Chatsworth Park. This is National Parks land and it may not be easy or cheap. I pointed out that HBRO were just beginning an initial look at Long Valley and Rushmoor Arena with the hope that another South Coast Club would join us.

#### New Officers of the ARC.

Basically the old team but with:-

- Lawrence Johnston as treasurer in place of Sue Whiteley.
- Charles Whittaker as Rover Group Liaison Officer
- June and Jack Green doing shows and displays (new post)

There were eight scrutineers' names in the hat and in view of the increasing profile of this side of our sport, all eight were accepted. So many? Well, if an urgent meeting is called, we stand a good chance of getting an worthwhile number. They are all keen types too.

Prior to the voting, it was announced that 15 of the 21 clubs present hadn't paid their subscription fee. You guessed it, HBRO was among them. No money = no vote so I paid up £65 from my startled wallet; where's the treasurer!!! To be fair, the year before last, we agreed that a reminder would be sent out. Last year we received it and paid. This year, the reminder was hidden in the back of Rover Runes and was obviously missed by the various members of HBRO who receive this particular newsletter.

Next ARC meeting is on June 13th. Let me know if you want to go so I can tell them for catering purposes.
