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ARC Meeting 13/09/92

The following ARC EGM report is made from non-shorthand notes and an imperfect memory! It's basically all there though.

Sadly, Tom Boydell has died. Tom was a staunch supporter over many many years of the ARC's activities. We will all miss him. One minutes silence was observed as a mark of respect.

- 1. Meeting officially opened.
- 2. Apologies for absence read out.
- 3. Acceptance of last meeting's minutes.
- 4. Matters arising from previous minutes.

Euro legislation :-

There are moves afoot to have seat belts fitted to all road going vehicles regardless of age

A ban on spurious parts (i.e. you may use only Rover sourced parts on a Rover car, for example) is not likely to occur.

The ARC flag and banners have been purchased and may be borrowed for major events.

5. Chairman's Report.

Rover company's new sales director is interested in the off-road club scene. More co-operation from Rover in the future?

Car Clubs. There was a long discussion relating to the disappearance of the Rover cars from the ARC scene. What can be done to encourage them and bring them back into the fold? A while back, a special period was set aside at a meeting for the car enthusiasts - not a single person showed up! Nevertheless, it was agreed that Tony Holder (currently council member without portfolio) would become Car Club Liaison Officer.

6. Secretary's Report.

Andy brought up a series of points, some spontaneous and some as the result of enquiring letters. Notably:-

You cannot officiate and compete at the same event. You can however, for example, scrutineer CCVT vehicles and then compete in an RTV.

Lincs ROC have put up a trophy for the National Rally for a team of three in the RTV.

Do passengers have to be club members? Apparently, there is nowt in the ARC rulings to say this has to be so. Passengers must sign on for insurance purposes, though.

Dave Barker enquired whether the review of the roll-bar regulations had been officially declared. It appears that although virtually every members present knew this was taking place, in fact no specific statement has been made. Steve Barnwell made up for this by so doing.

An ARC flag and two banners had bee purchased. These are being held by June and Jack green. These can be loaned for major events.

ARC yearbook - where is it? Steve Kirby showed a draft copy.

If you need to send documentation to the police in pursuance of an off-road event, it is recommended that you take the documentation to the police station and get a signed receipt there and then.

The ARC has had only two applications for exemption from other clubs. In both cases, these were forwarded to more appropriate bodies.

7. Treasurer's report.

RAC Recovery renewals must be sent to the new ARC treasurer, Lawrence Johnson, 4, Waltham House, Overend Street, West Bromwich, West Midlands, B70 6ER.

The National rally accounts seemed to be in a bit of a mess. No sponsorship money had come in because no invoices had been sent to the sponsors! No exact records could be found as to just what the agreements with the sponsors had been! In order to keep the debt collectors at bay, the ARC has had to draw on its "buffer", the building society account. The problem seems to arise from the fact that we gave Sue Whiteley the OK to carry on being treasurer to deal with the National rally despite Lawrence being voted as new treasurer. So both

Sue and Lawrence have some of the documentation each, so neither knows the whole story. There is no suggestion of dishonesty here, just a breakdown in communications. It's not the way a limited company should carry on, though. Anyone who has any financial dealings left over from the National rally please forward them to Lawrence by 30th September.

Finally, he pointed out that it would seem that the Range Rover Register still have not paid this year. Although a subject for humour perhaps, this has a serious side in that permits etc. for events are not valid.

8.

(i) Caravan Officer.

The new exemption certificate will now cover us until 1997. However, we can lose this easily if we break any of its conditions.

Holiday Rally applications; camping events longer than five days; three months notice is needed. Public liability insurance is also necessary. ARC is an ACCEO (Association of Camping and Caravanning Exempt Organisations) members and if you fly a club flag at an event, then you must fly an ACCEO flag too. These will be loaned free by that organisation.

- (ii) Club Shop Dave Mitchell was not present.
- (iii) Overseas Liaison Officer Fran Luxton explained that she was dealing with a backlog of items.
- (iv) Rights of Way. Tony Kempster brought up a host of topics:-

The BMF is fighting an action in which the judiciary are supporting a withdrawal of vehicular rights because the road surface is unsealed. If this succeeds, we may find all unsealed roads being similarly treated.

On 20th October, the case involving the TRO on the Ridgeway, comes up. There are over 600 protests.

Plus numerous other items which he will detail in Runes at a later date.

- (v) National Rally Liaison Officer Not Present.
- (vi) Magazine editor. Andrew Neaves:-

Copy date for the next issue in 23rd October. He may have to hand the job to someone else soon.

(vii) Press, Publicity & Sponsorship - Dave Barker.

Suggested that he seek sponsorship to support the ARC. Those present gave him the go-ahead to see what was available.

- (viii) RACMSA Liaison Officer Dickie Day's report comes later.
- (ix) Rover Liaison Charles Whitaker is away testing a Land Rover in Austria alright for some, isn't it?
- (x) Technical Officer Bob Ivins not present as usual.
- (xi) Scrutineers Steve Barnwell;

Red lights on comp safari vehicles - have you fitted yours yet?

Comp Safari windscreens - Another RACMSA cock-up! If you HAVE a windscreen, then it must be laminated glass or plastic at least 4mm thick.

- (xii) Shows and Displays June and Jack Green; Not present as they were attending a show or display!
- 9. National Rally 1993. On target for Eastnor. Application forms should be around by November.
- 10. National Rally 1994/5

1994 Peak & Dukeries will confirm in December that their event at Bakewell will go ahead.

1995 Lincolnshire LROC are still on line.

11 Results of ARC Referendum. This has not taken place - see next item.

12. ARC and its Authorisation. The RACMSA has moved its wheeled goal-posts again. The ARC's proposals to the RACMSA was that for RTVs and CCVTs would need only a club card but that all others would need a competition licence. A meeting to discuss this takes place on September 17th to review these proposals but Dickie didn't really hold out much hope of success.

Regarding roll-bars, the ARC's specs beat the RAC ones into the ground. Don't forget though that the design philosophy is quite different between the ARC and the RAC. The RAC designs are a "crash once and replace" type, the ARC ones are a "roll it back on its wheels and carry on" type.

Regarding applications to the ARC for exemptions from prosecution, the applying club must submit vehicle and event regulations for perusal. You see, if the ARC grants exemption from the provisions of the RTA, then an alternative set must be brought into use. The ARC can eventually provide these of course but at present we rely on the RAC Blue Book ones. Dickie has talked to the Chairman of the AWDC with regard to using theirs. Its highly probable that if the ARC leaves the RACMSA and issues its own exemptions, then the AWDC too will leave the RACMSA and apply to the ARC for its exemptions. On this basis the ARC may be able to use the AWDC's Event and safety rules mentioned.

The aforementioned referendum will be organised after the September 17th meeting as some changes may just occur.

So what's needed by an authorising organisation such as the ARC? Basically it needs a set of event regs, safety regs, Vehicle regs and an insurance set-up. Other items such as regulations regarding protests, fairplay etc. will be incorporated into the system too.

- 13. Regulation changes. (Very brief headings)
- a) Events shared with non-ARC clubs to be increased from 2 to 3 each year.
- b) Free-concept RAC certificated roll-bars to be allowed
- c) Lap strap required on RTVs regardless of vehicle age.
- d) Vehicles that don't fit a specific class can compete in the nearest equivalent.
- e) Comp Safari different passengers can be carried on different "runs"

- f) Passengers should be member of an ARC club.
- g) Trials class 9 to be 80" only. New class 10 for 86", 88" & Ninety specials.
- h) ASR for CCVT must carry 1.5kg fire extinguisher. RTV strongly recommended to carry same.
- i) List of clubs and delegates attending ARC meetings
- j) Manner of voting by individual delegates to be listed in Rover Runes along with the way they voted (unless vote is unanimous)
- k) RTV and CCVT may use aluminium wheels of a make other than Rover.

Many years ago, the first National was run by the Midland Club at Eastnor Park under the watchful eye of the land owner, Major Harvey Bathurst. As a gesture of thanks, the Midland ROC gave the Major a beautiful rose bowl for his mantle-piece. After the event, he got to hear comments that the Summertime national event was dry and easy and lacked real challenge. He was annoyed by this and said "You should try it when it's cold and wet later in the year" So he threw down the challenge and arranged a trial in the rainy season and put the rose bowl forward as the trophy. Ever since then, an intentionally very difficult trial has been organised by MROC in October with the Major's rose bowl as the (returnable!) prize. It was therefore in keeping with this history that the events often end up being run in bad weather; the resulting conditions making it very much a trial for the experienced driver. It was therefore particularly pleasing that HBRO should win the event last year under very wet conditions. Note that there are no runners-up in this classless event; it's winner take all, although there are special prizes for the best team of "Standard" Land Rovers. All vehicles must fit one of the defined ARC classes. As mentioned above, the trial is intentionally difficult and is really suited to CCVT classes.

Following our win last year, it was a surprise to get only just enough interest to enter two teams this year. Mind you, we don't really have that many CCVT vehicles in the club but we did have three full teams of three last time. Do come along to watch - it's a terrific event.

Location is at Eastnor Castle, near Ledbury. From Tewkesbury, take the A438 Westwards to Ledbury, crossing the M50 as you go. Eastnor is just short of Ledbury. If you take the A417 NW from Gloucester, (again crossing the M50), a few miles short of Ledbury you will see turnings to the right for Eastnor which is on the A438 running parallel a couple of miles to the North. There is no closing date for camping - just turn up if you want to support the club. Please note that this year, lorries will not be admitted to the camping field.


Note that some of the rules have just been changed again. ALL the changes will allow many currently prohibited vehicles to compete again as of January next year, so that is all good news.

Please come along on Saturday to help lay out. On the Sunday, please enrol as a marshal once in a while, we'll show you how to score if you've not done it before!




RTV at Weston Underwood 18th October


Invite from BUX 4x4 to RTV Trials Low Farm, October 4th Wapsey's Wood, October 25th.
