All those who registered with the RACMSA to compete in the latter half of 1992 SHOULD have received a Blue Book and the RACMSA Newsletters. I understand that very few of you received much other than the registration document itself. As I mentioned before, the 4th Quarter RASCMSA NEWS printed a table of what licences you would need for 1993. I published this information in the

December 92 P&B in good faith. The 1993 RACMSA YEARBOOK followed shortly and gave contradictory information which I published in the Jan. 93 P&B.

So as a reminder, you will need a CLUBMAN'S licence for Comp Safari, Timed Trials, Point-to-Point and Team Recovery. You won't need anything other than an ARC club membership card for RTV and CCVT events.

If you are keen to know what is going on regarding RACMSA matters, the cheap way of getting a 1993 "Blue Book" and the quarterly newsletters is to apply for a Clubman's licence which will cost you £10.

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
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# RTV & CCV Trial Broxhead Common, May 2nd

# ARC Meeting Solihull, 12th December 1992.

The usual HBRO team of Steve Kirby and Steve Barnwell travelled to Solihull for the EGM. Why don't some of the rest of you come? In time honoured fashion, I will describe some of the highlights of the meeting.

#### Matters arising from previous meetings minutes:-

- · A few corrections and misprints were amended.
- Rulebook. This refers to the rules for running the ARC as a whole.
   Apart from the constitution, the other rules and regulations by which the ARC is run don't seem to be written down in a coherent fashion. The ARC Secretary, Andy Stavordale is doing this.
- ARC Yearbook. This is to be in modular form and bound in a ringbook. Steve Kirby is doing this and a prototype has been sent to Andy Stavordale.

#### Chairman's Report.

- Peter Oakden stated there had been a Council meeting in November and they had discussed the accounts and expenses of the ARC and also discussed the possible opt-out of the RACMSA. The latter topic is to be subject to a special review by Tony Holder (previous chairman of the ARC). He will take an in-depth look at the future policy of "doing our own thing" as we are authorising body in our own right. Do we really need the RACMSA?
- Company liaison. Land Rover Ltd have stated that they cannot support the ARC with cash but are willing to provide support in other ways.
- The long delay in subs payment by the Range Rover Register brought forth the comment from them that their members did not know what the ARC is! So why don't the publishers of their newsletter tell them then? We had 80 questionnaires back from RRR members, so some of them know. The ARC shop at the National Rally was run by RRR members; how can they say they don't know much about the ARC!!
- We are still owed a lot of money by several organisations who had trade stands at the National rally. The treasurer would name them later.

Secretary's Report; Andy Stavordale brought up the following matters:-

- Following the above item, if you are having trade stands or sponsors at an event, do make the arrangements via written contracts and define charges, fees etc. in advance. We tend to be too laid back and gentlemanly in such arrangements. We are running a serious risk of losing the National Rally monies that are owed to us because we are not hard-headed enough.
- Subs do sent the fees to the right address. The RRR sent theirs to Dickie Day, who hasn't been the Secretary for two years now!
- Andy felt that the quality of the newsletter was poor. The content is fine. We will have to allocate more money to it if we want a better newsletter. Perhaps some of the undefined "support" from LR Ltd could be in the form of a good quality newsletter produced in house by the publication dept.
- Following the comment that RRR members don't know much about the ARC - it's possible that RRR members think that the ARC is for competitions only and as few of them compete they think the ARC is not relevant to them. The social side of the ARC should be publicised more.

#### Treasurer's report. Lawrence Johnson.

- Regarding the National Rally, we are owed £3300 from sponsors and stand holders. Some of the trade stand companies have refused to pay at all and some have paid only half or less, refusing to pay more.
  - (I did take hasty notes of details here but in case I've got any wrong, I will refrain from printing the amounts until I have confirmation. However, such notables as LRO Magazine, John Craddock and Southdown Engineering are withholding large sums that are owing to the ARC.)
- All letters regarding payment of membership fees should be sent by Jan 20th.

#### Scrutineers Report Steve Barnwell.

Now we have a much larger committee, we are getting more done.
 That may sound a little odd but now that most of the major critics of the rules and the scrutineering committee are now ON that committee, we are actually getting a lot done.

- Following the proposals for rule changes, here are the Scrutineering Committee's deliberations on the items:-
- Free concept roll-bars rejected mainly due to the fear that eventually, only commercial/professionally produced roll-bars would be acceptable.
- Lap straps (minimum) for all Where vehicles had fittings for seat belts, then they must be used. A strong recommendation should be issued to fit seat-belts to older vehicles for which there is no legal requirement.
- Standard production vehicles which do not fit an existing class should be allowed to compete in the nearest appropriate class Agreed but a start date of, say, Jan 1993 should be included.
- Coil Sprung 80" specials should have their own class accepted mainly on the basis that leaf sprung 80" specials already have a class of their own.
- Fire extinguishers should be mandatory on CCVT vehicles and recommended for RTVs accepted with the provisos that allowances be made to account for the forthcoming changes in fire-extinguisher legislation.
- Aluminium wheels for RTV and CCVTs. Accepted for RTVs, rejected for CCVTs.
- Note that these are the recommendations of the scrutineering committee. They will be voted on at the 1993 AGM. So how would you like the HBRO representative to vote?

Caravan Secretary. Jim Campbell was not present.

#### Club Shop. Dave Mitchell

 There has been very little response from member clubs to the stock list that has been circulated. Dave pointed out that he will have to step down soon due to commercial conflicts. Stock will still be available through him, though.

#### Overseas Liaison Officer. Fran Luxton.

 Overseas clubs want badges, stickers etc. They also want entry forms for the 1993 ARC National rally. Discounts are available from ferry companies for members taking competition cars across the channel (either way)

Rights of Way:- Tony Kempster raised the following points:-

- Information regarding clearing of rights of way is needed. Please send information, pictures etc. to Tony Kempster. (Knelle Hill Lodge, Beckley, Rye, East Sussex, TN31 6UD)
- On April 21st there will be a Motor sport Planning Symposium in Leamington Spa. More details to come later.

National rally Liaison Officer. Harold Lowe was not present.

#### Rover Runes Magazine Editor. Andrew Neave.

 Accepted that Runes could be improved but it would cost money or, as mentioned before, perhaps LR Ltd could publish it.

#### Press Publicity and Sponsorship. Dave Barker.

Nothing to say.

#### RACMSA Representative. Dickey Day:-

- Speed events Comp safaris should not be run the way they are.
  The description in the RAC Yearbook should be adhered to or the
  event that we run should be given a different name. This would
  almost certainly result in a considerable increase in fees as it
  would come under the definition of a rally.
- The ARC can now do anything that the RACMSA can do except sanction events on public roads and issue international licences. The ARC, or an ARC-based company, could authorise its own event permits etc., but he didn't believe that would really happen due to apathy within the ARC. We would need at least one full-time paid manager.

#### Rover Co. Liaison Officer. Charles Whitaker.

LR Ltd have offered the ARC non-cash support. what do we want?
 He would ask LR to investigate the possibility of publishing Rover Runes.

<u>Technical Officer</u>. Bob Ivins was not present, again. Will he ever reappear?

 Visitors to shows see the ARC name but don't understand that the ARC is an umbrella organisation embracing about 35 other individual clubs
