### Making a Range Rover Radiator last Longer

The RR radiator is:-

- a) prone to flexing cos its a big jobby and unsupported in the middle.
- b) expensive to replace.

My replacement Serck radiator has four tapped holes in the top and bottom plates. The rad when in its normal position sits over the front crossmember, so I've utilised these holes to make up supports out of hard-rubber door-stops spaced out with 1" dia alloy bar. Hopefully the stops have enough 'give' to allow a little flex but the rad is now supported in 8 places instead of the standard 4.

The only thing that must be carefully measured is the length of thread needed to \*just\* go through the cover plates...High Tensile allen bolts wouldn't do the core much good if they were wound in too far.....

Hope this is of use...



#### Do It!! (I did)

Having recently joined the HBRO, I thought I would give trialling a 'go'. I realise that a Series III LWB hardtop is not the ideal vehicle for trialling, but that didn't matter because I was going for some fun rather than to win anything. So having fitted the extra spring to the carb, removed the drop plate for the tow hitch and cleared out the accumulation of loose debris that had collected behind the seats, I set out for Hook End Farm on the 9th April.

I arrived at the site and found two ambulances in the field, and I wondered what had I let my self in for? Luckily they were lost and looking for a motor cycle competition that was taking place near by. I visited the HBRO trailer and completed a couple of forms, handed over £15 and received my scrutineering form and my score card. My Land Rover was the scrutineered, then there was a drivers' briefing, then the fun began.

I watched most of the other competitors attempt the first section then my turn arrived, I drove through a Hazel bush, so I could save my 'shunt' for later in the section, only to get grounded on a hump (I blame it on the wheelbase, other competitors said I was not going fast enough), after being pushed off the hump I drove round the rest of the section. As the morning progressed I was getting better. However while inspecting one section, there was nearly a disaster, I had not put the hand brake on hard enough and my Land Rover was rolling across the field with no one in it. Luckily one of the other competitors managed to catch it before any damage was done.

During the lunch break I thought I better check underneath to see it everything was OK. Oil was dripping from the back of the engine!! A quick inspection of the engine revealed that I had lost one of the bolts that hold the tappet guides in place, and oil was being pumped out of the hole! Being a practical sort of a person, I removed one of the bolts that secure the hardtop, cut it to length then used it to plug the hole. (Try doing that in a Tdi Discovery.) Steve Kirby gave me some oil to replace that which I had lost. I then continued eating my lunch.

During the afternoon we did several more sections and I even managed to 'clear' one section! By the end of the day I was last (but I had the biggest score!!), it had been a brilliant day. So all you non-competitive members of HBRO "Do it. I did".

When I have a few moments spare, I intent to make my Land Rover more competitive, I will try adjusting the steering stops to give a better turning circle and remove the front bump-stops to give more axle movement.

Finally I would like to thank everyone involved in the event, the organisers, the marshals and the competitors for their friendly encouragement and advice.



### Nellies Dell Trials. 30th April.

This was a camping, site clearing, trialling weekend at our very own exclusive site. The general attendance was good and the weather fair. The camping area is above and well away from the nearby main road. A barbecue was held on Saturday night which went down well.

A few more dead trees have been cleared and so more land is available. The long-awaited syndicate trialler appeared, owned by Gary Langton and the Nicks Jennings and Woodage. It just scraped through scrutineering with a couple of warnings but wasn't too bad for its first event. The springs are clearly too stiff for such a light vehicle and a front hoop is to be fitted but it goes well and looks good (ish!). Try taking a few leaves out of the spring set fellas but don't go less than 5. If you start with the 11-leaf set, you can end up with nice soggy springs but you'll need much longer spring hangers. (See rules A.9 and B.3.1.) The scores show the three owner / drivers to be well matched but have a way to go to catch Brian's extensively rebuilt and well sorted 6-cylinder Series One. We again had a first time RTVer, Mick Stables, who was doing well until his gearbox jammed in gear. The removal of the rear prop and unlocking of the front hubs was necessary even before he could be towed. A call to the RAC courtesy Ashley's mobile and a tow to the farm gate by me saw him on his way home. Problem turned out to be that the linkage had fallen apart inside the gearbox and the fix cost about £80. Incidentally, Mick's Landy appears in the 1995 Land Rover diary. Don't forget that the RAC Rescue and Recovery deal. (available at a good discount through the ARC) will undertake to recover you from a trial site anywhere. It was the first trial for Dave Jennings too (no relation to Nick). Certainly a creditable score too. Alan Smith's Ninety now has 4,7:1 ratio diffs instead of the original 3.5s. This is a very worthwhile conversion for 2.5 litre vehicles. The improved handling characteristics that come with lower gear ratios enabled Alan to achieve his first class win. Unfortunately I forgot to ask him to write the report so I'm doing it again this month! Steve Kendall continues to drive his 109 in an enthusiastic and entertaining manner and managed to beat a couple of Range Rovers! Some of the RTV sections were a bit tight in places so the LWBs had different routes on a couple of sections, and the odd gate was moved here or there. This isn't a criticism of those who laid it all out as they didn't have a LWB available to test the sections. Andrew Simpson and Neville Dewdney had a run-off as they both scored only one point each.

At the end of the day, other exciting things started to happen. At the other end of the farm where the paint-ball "mob" had been playing, an unexploded bomb had been found. The railway had formed a major link to the south coast during WW2 and so it is not surprising that it was bombed regularly. (The two pits at Brick Kiln Farm are reputed to be bomb craters.) Consequently, the police and bomb squad were arriving in some numbers as we departed the site. The local news stated that it was a smoke bomb, but dangerous

nonetheless.



#### The National Grid

The original Ordnance Survey was a survey of the roads and terrain of England and Wales in order to assess their suitability for the movement of heavy artillery - ordnance. The first full survey was carried out between 1799 and 1811. The first maps were actually drawn to 2" to 1 mile. When the copper plates were made for printing, they were scaled down to 1" to 1 mile - and remained at that scale for over 100 years - the "inch" maps.

Originally, latitude and longitude were marked on these maps, but later on, a grid system was introduced due to the long numbers involved with latitude and longitude. The main grid consists of twenty-five, 500km squares lettered A to Z and laid out as shown in fig.1.

Note that the letter I is not used in case it gets confused with the number 1. As you can see, Great Britain occupies only three of these squares. Each of these 500km squares is further divided into twenty-five 100km squares similarly



lettered.See fig.2. A combination of the letters of both squares is used to delineate an area and the codes appear on all current OS maps. The majority of south and west England lie in square S in fig.1. Hampshire and Berkshire lie mainly in square U in fig.2. On Landranger maps, the letters are in outline blue style either in the corner of each map or on the boundaries of the squares where these occur. On Pathfinder maps, the letter code is shown in the border of the sheet itself. As an example, Basingstoke falls into square SU, i.e. main square S, sub-square U. The means of obtaining the map reference of any given point is described on each OS Landranger map, but perhaps a repeat would not go amiss:

- a) Pick your point on the map.
- b) Move to the LEFT to the nearest VERTICAL line. (e.g. 12)
- c) Guess the number of tenths to the RIGHT of this line (e.g. 3)

This is called the EASTING and is 123 in the example.

- d) Move DOWN to the nearest HORIZONTAL line. (e.g. 45)
- e) Guess the tenths above this line. (e.g. 6)

This is called the NORTHING, and is 456 in the example.

- f) Look on the map for the ident letters, as described above.(e.,g. SU)
- g) Put the whole lot together. In our example this will be SU123456.

The order in which you carry out the above procedure is important. I remember it by thinking of an aeroplane taking off - it has to go ALONG before it can go UP. Or maybe you can think of it as walking ALONG the corridor and UP the stairs. That is you look at the numbers ALONG the top or bottom of the map first before you look at the numbers UP the sides.

If you use very large scale maps, the tenths described may be divided into more tenths, i.e. one-hundredths of a square resulting in very long references such as SU12345678. Sometimes the Landranger sheet number is used in place of, or even in addition to the other codes. If the sheet is number 123, you may see a reference written as 123123456.

To reverse the procedure, take your reference number and split it into it's three parts, such as 123 123 456 or SU 123 456 as given in the examples above.

The first part will be either the Landranger sheet number or the 100km square identification letters. The next two digits, the Easting, should be read from the horizontal edges of the map (the top and bottom). Next, read the first two digits from the third part of the reference (the Northing) and match these to the numbers on the sides of the map. Where these two lines cross will be at the bottom-left, South-West, corner of a 1km square. Checking the tenths out in the same way will identify the point within that square.

Inside the heavy line on the following table are the numbers of all the Pathfinder maps that cover Berkshire and Hampshire. Some of the surrounding area is also included. As you can see, there is a fair number. I have a set of these maps for my own use and through the generosity of Nick Jennings, the

Most of you are, I'm sure familiar with the OS Landranger series of maps. These are to a scale of 1:50 000, there being around 205 in the set. They are fitted in between the coastlines so you are not paying for too much sea! This results in odd positioning and lots of overlaps. Pathfinder Maps are to a scale of 1:25 000. There are several of these to each Landranger and you can easily end up buying a lot of the North Sea, but there are no overlaps. They are 20 km East to West and 10km North to South. They cost about the same as Landrangers, so they should be chosen with care as they don't cover much area. You used to be able to calculate which ones you wanted from the map references, but a recent numbering system change means that you will need to get the "Index to Pathfinder and 1:10 000 Map series" from Ordnance Survey to find out which ones you need.

## Camping, RTV and CCV Trials at Harroway Farm, Ramsdean, Petersfield. June 9 - 11.




