ARC NATIONAL RALLY BLANKNEY PARK 1995

The ARC National has come and gone again and we hope a good time was had by all who went. My own interest is the RTV trials which were held on the Saturday and since this was only my second ARC, I was looking forward to it.

Departure time came with the arrival of Neville Dewdney dressed in a very bright pair of beach shorts, he must have known in advance that we were bound for the deserts of Lincolnshire. The wife did a quick dash upstairs and grabbed my shorts, thinking Neville must know what he was up to. By Watford I knew why Neville was wearing shorts. We both had 2.5 petrol engines and it felt as if we were sitting on top of the barbecue. Not being used to these old fashioned engines I thought we had troubles and was ready to turn around and return home to get my TDi Defender. A quick word with Neville on the CB sort of put my mind at rest and he reassured me that this was normal. We then opened every air vent and did our best to bring the cab temperature down. Henry our Welsh Springer Spaniel gave a sigh of relief rolled over and went back to sleep.

We were travelling fast or so I thought till I checked with Neville again. My speedo said we were doing 60 mph but he brought me back to earth again by confirming that all we were doing was 45 mph. The combination of 7:50 tyres and 4.76 diffs was confusing my speedo. We progressed up the A1 at steady 45/50 mph watching the fuel gauge go down rapidly and the price of petrol going up at every garage we passed. About half way up we were following this 4x4 with a trailer thinking "Is he heading for the same destination?" when all of a sudden he saw the car he had been sent to retrieve slams on his brakes and he almost ended up with both my 90 and caravan sitting across his trailer.

The journey from Frimley Green to Blankney took four hours and we arrived just after 6 o'clock thinking we had plenty of time to settle in and have a cup of coffee before we set off for scrutineering. What a mistake that was, two and half hours later we passed, but what a wait.

It gave you time to get to know other drivers at the same time hearing of the large number of failures and wondering what was going on. The main stumbling block was fuel tank caps which had to have a non-return valve to prevent loss of fuel. Half way through the tests the supply of fuel tank caps on site had had been exhausted and drivers were resorting to any devious solution to the problem including borrowing the cap from someone who had passed only to find that they still failed on fuel tank caps; just no logic in it. My turn eventually came and I drove up the ramp to test my handbrake, just then the scrutineer was called away to look at something else leaving me parked up the ramp for over five minutes. Handbrake passed so on into the tent for the major inquisition by the scrutineers. They tugged, pulled and pushed, I am suprised that they did not wrench all four wheels off the effort they put into it. At last both agreed and pass the vehicle so now time to book in and collect by card and number. Just one problem had to go and get the wife so we could both sign on together.

Scrutineering over and time for dinner, time now 10.30pm, jacket

potatoes ready to play cricket with, dig out the barbecue cook the meat, open a nice bottle of wine and ready to pass out. Just one more thing to do before we could finally pass out, walk the dog picking up a full bag of doggy dropping just to make sure Nick did not but his foot in it.

Up early the following morning Henry the dog licking my face to tell me it was walky time. Breakfast over set off for line up, blast! Left my score card back in the caravan, turn around rapidly and nearly cause a major pile up with other vehicles coming in to get lined up. Eventually we set off in convoy driving for what seemed like miles, ending up at Metherington quarry to disappear in to what seemed like a bottomless pit. The vehicles at the bottom seemed like ants all playing follow my leader. We arrive at the first section and we all get out to go and walk the course when this nice young lady comes over to me and tells me vou are first, panic! What have I done to deserve this? Oh well let's get on with it. I had my 90 prepared for trees, water, mud, grass and what did we get sand, gravel and big boulders. Time to walk the course thinking this must be the CCVT not the RTV course, so what are we doing here? Confidence level now at an all time low, first section, first driver and then Steve Kirby and Dave Cuthbert add to my doom by saying the SAT's on my vehicle were not ideal for this sand and gravel. They were right of course, gate six left me cross axled and going no where. In the end it was only the longer wheel base Range Rovers of Steve Kirby and Paul Webb that make it through to the last gate, the shunts helped as they always do. First section gave us our first casualty gate six again and a 90 with front wheels going in different directions, track rod bent. Out comes the heavy mob and in short time they are ready to continue again.

The first six sections here in Metherington Quarry were a nightmare and I only managed one near clear section all morning getting a 1 on the last section of the morning making it a total of 41 points. The morning saw two retirements from our group; track rod and differential problems.

One highlight of the morning was Henry our dog who found the only water in the quarry and went paddling in it of course. Bearing in mind that he had to sit on the cubby box between sections this was not good news. So I thought I would be clever and wash him by laying him on the canvas pick up cover. He did not appreciate this and struggled hitting me right across by face with his very muddy paws. 

- H.22.13.3. Tow points do not need to be painted in contrasting colours.

Awards will be given for 1st 2nd & 3rd overall and in Classes, provided entries justify this. Other awards may be presented as anounced in the programme.

Prize giving will be as shown in the programme.

Minimum entries will be:

Winch/Team Recovery - 3 teams each

Comp Safari - 10.

ADDITIONAL SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1995 Interclub Event - August Bank Holiday

All events are held under the General Regulations of the RACMSA, incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA, and the Supplementary Regulations of the ARC and P & D LRC(1983) Ltd.

- * Site speed limit is 5 mph, other than while competing.
- Eligibility of competitors will be determined by production of any ARC Competitive Club membership card
- Any ARC-recognised class of Land-Rover will be eligible to enter.
- All vehicles must be provided with suitable recovery points front & rear. These need not be painted in contrasting colours.
- * A spare wheel need not be carried.
- All competing vehicles must be equipped with at least a 2.5kg BCF fire extinguisher or AFFF equivalent, unless more is specified by ARC regulations. Dry powder and CO2 extinguishers will not be acceptable.
- If a passenger/navigator is carried, they must be present throughout the event, or the driver will become ineligible for a trophy. (This rule may be varied at the discretion of the C of C in cases of sickness or emergency.
- * A suitable tow rope (not chain or wire rope) must be carried.
- * Open block tread tyres (maxicross etc.) will not be permitted.
- * No-one to ride between sections in vehicles, unless seated.
- * Bicycles must not enter the competition area whilst the events are in progress.
- Competitors must obtain a scrutineering ticket prior to presenting their vehicle to the scrutineers, and do so at least one hour prior to the start of the event. Failure to do so may lead to exclusion, at the discretion of the Clerk of Course.
- Prizes will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd in class, depending on numbers of entries.
 Amalgamations will be to ARC recommendations.
- Running orders will be allocated on the day by marshalls. Competitors shall be identified by name or number.
- * Marshalls' decision is final.
- * There shall be no practising on the comp safari site without the permission of the C of C.
