



Recently I have received several questions resulting from the Trialling article in the Greenbook. I have always taken it with a pinch of salt, partly because it is only a guideline, and partly because I know where it came from, but it is evident that some members think that as it is in

L&C practice, and is I believe we have a north-south divide situation here) and involves using only one marker, that shows the gate number, the other cane being unlabelled. To comply with RACMSA rules this marker is put on the RH cane. It is obviously a clearly visible colour. In fact our current ones are orange and lime

green (to differentiate between RTV & CCV) but red has been used in the past.

The article implies this is wrong, whereas it is just different.

To go back a couple of sentences, "the section consists usually of 10 pairs of canes." The Bluebook, if I remember rightly (Janice now has 'my' copy!) specifies 12 gates (or 13 including a start gate. I strongly support clubs individual methods, but to suggest that the usual is contrary to the rules is I think a dangerous thing.

The width of gates, this is one of the commonest misunderstandings as I have often heard claims that "The rules say a gate must be at least ten feet wide." I'm not even sure where that figure came from (AWDC?) as the RAC say 4 metres, and that appears to apply to PCTs. (Production Car Trials, Ed.) Don't get me wrong, I am not a fan of narrow gates, but am doubtful about an actual ban as there can be rare occasions when there is a case for a narrow gate, especially in very dry conditions on an undemanding site.

Finally in the Instructions to Marshals, 2,2 Ten penalties for not starting, strange when 6.2 & 6.3 talk of 12 penalties (for a ten gate section?).

I am sorry for raising this so late considering the article as been around

for years, it came to a head at a recent event when we nearly had a protest when a competitor was awarded a 12.

Oh, and a final thought "At the End of the Event" Whilst waiting for the results it is a good idea to see if the organisers want any help collecting canes, packing up equipment etc., before being selfish and sorting you own motor out. That is another reason for holding a prize giving after an event, it doesn't take place until the equipment officer says so! Incidentally we have recently started a system where it is your job to go back and clear the section you went first on (another reason for running in numerical order?) which works fairly well.

Ferguson Formula.

Your interesting article reminded me of an article in All Wheel Driver during the early eighties. It was about, if I remember rightly, Alvin Smith's latest creation (he was the man to beat at the time), which had Schuler transmission which utilised the Ferguson Formula system. It was instructions on how to check the system was working and went something like this:-

- Remove front propshaft.
- Line vehicle up on flat, dry, tarmac road.
- Engage 1st gear and build revs up to 3000 rpm.
- Drop clutch.
- Go back and measure length of black lines left by front wheels.

Thanks for that Dave. At least someone reads the Handbook! The Blue Book says "H.1.2.4. Section markers should comply with M.1.3.8." This means that you must comply with this. However, the referenced regulation starts "It is recommended that sections be laid out......." So it isn't compulsory after all! M.1.3.8. actually mentions 13 pairs of marker stakes anyway. I have amended the ARC Handbook to match the penalty to the number of gates, regardless of how many there are!

Thanks for the comments about Ferguson Formula although I suspect there is a minor typo in your letter as removing the front prop-shaft would remove the drive from the front wheels and hence there'd be no skid marks from them. I didn't know the Schuler system was FF configuration. I know the Range Rover had Schuler transmission for a while so presumably such a system would be ARC-legal.

Following Paul Oldham's letter in the April issue on diesel emissions, may I relate a recent experience with my very worn 2½ diesel. It recently failed the MoT. Emissions were 3.6 m-I (Pass is 2.5 or lower). Not being able to afford a rebuild (£800 plus removal and replacement plus MOT). I decided to try some oil and fuel additives, Wynn's STOP-SMOKE (2 bottles for luck) in the oil and EXHAUST CLEAN in the fuel tank. Result:- average emissions of 1.08 m-I and hardly any smoke - PASS.

That's me OK for another year but can anyone tell me what these things do to the inside of the engine?

Er no. I can't tell you how or why they work, but they do. I have great faith in Wynn's various gunges and goos. My first Rangy had a noisy tappet. I tried Wynne's "Engine Tune-Up" which stated that it cures sticky hydraulic tappets. It worked a treat.

My 101 was on its way to failing on emissions recently until the testers noticed that it needed only a visual check for smoke (it's 21 this year.) It also took a while to persuade them it was a class IV Dual-Purpose vehicle. 1 Tonne 4x4 User Handbook, Army release papers and close examination of the Motor Vehicles Construction & Use Act to the rescue! (It passed.)
