

The LARA Conference, April 1996, held at the Heritage Motor Centre, Gaydon

Firstly, may I apologise to you for not being able to include this account in the last issue of the magazine as promised; 'pressure of work' seems to be a phrase that crops up a lot these days, and I'm no more immune to it that anyone else....

Firstly, a bit of background, with a nod to those of you who know this already....LARA (Land Access and Recreational Association) was formed in 1986 as a response:-

- 1) to changes in perceptions and expectations in our use of the countryside;
- 2) to the general tightening of planning controls
- 3) to the realisation that having common goals and combined strength was the only way in which motorsport would be able to continue to have a meaningful lobby.

LARA is not a governing body of any of its members; receives Sports Council recognition and aid; co-ordinates the policies and actions of the individual groups; and acts as a focal point for other organisations both within and outside motorsport

LARA has fostered the image that as responsible users we are 'part of the solution', and as such is involved in many aspects of motorsport, from lobbying about the Environment Bill, to the recording of notification of all SSSIs from English Nature. Berkshire and the Lake District are only two districts in which LARA is active, and the 10th anniversary Conference was as much a review of progress as the delivery of a forward plan. Steve Kirby and myself were fortunate in being able to represent HBRO, and we are both of the opinion that it was a very valuable forum for a club such as ours.

The Forum was opened by Alan Bennet, MP, who spoke on the Report of the Select Committee and mentioned one of their findings, which was that identifiable 'honey spots' could normally be expected to recover with only 5 years respite. He mentioned that many users of the countryside do not actually need to be in the countryside in order to enjoy their chosen sport, and cited waterski-ing as an example. Noise was nowadays perceived to be the biggest intrusion.

The speakers were drawn from many different areas, and not all had a 'natural' leaning towards motorsport; for instance, Bob Cartwright, of the Lake District National Park, has to balance the perception of the Lakes as a place of 'quiet enjoyment' with the rights of recreational motorsport pursuits; and his talk was focused on the ways in which co-operation was proving to be the best way

forward in many initiatives. There are 300 UCRs and Byways and 42000 people making a living inside National Parks boundaries, and the theme of co-operation was pressed home again.

Geoff Wilson, the Deputy Chairman of LARA, noted that there was to be no change in the principles that guide the organisation, but that there will be a change to project-based operations. He also noted the need to divorce tobacco advertising from motorsport.

Angela Sydenham, a former Chief Legal Adviser of the CLA, spoke about that organisation and its existence for the protection of properly rights, whilst maintaining the rights of users. Understanding the Law is the key to reduction in conflict, and to 'deny legitimate Rights of Way' is not the answer. She finished by summarising in a most professional manner, through the use of OHP (overhead projector) slides, the different approaches to given strategic problems, and by strange coincidence, the proposals made by GLEAM were by far the most draconian and bigoted... but then again, would we expect anything different?

The full conference pack is quite a heavy affair, and it now resides in my study. Members are most welcome to borrow it for individual study, please phone me to arrange transport.

Things are a bit quiet at the moment as far as club activities are concerned, my contribution to this is that I have been down with Chicken Pox - what a way to enjoy this hot spell!

Anyway, on Sunday 16th June a few of us went off to play in Hampshire... and just for a change, my Rangey threw its toys out of the cot. This time, it wasn't anything serious... just a fire in the wiring loom is all. As a result of this, its now for sale... some MOT, some tax, full roll cage, would suit a club trialler... £600 or near offer.

THE FAMILY EVENT

National Rally 1996

It would be hard to write a report on the 1996 ARC National Rally without mentioning the weather, so I'm not even going to try to avoid it. It must be many years since I've pitched a tent in the rain and wind. Although we had the noise of the nearby road to contend with, we had the only flat bit of field! Having pitched (patch?) the tent, I zoomed off at about 3 o'clock Friday to scrutineering but caught them out as the 101 wouldn't go in the scrutineering tent! Land Rovers don't come much taller than this but the scrutineers were able to see all they needed without having to lie down right underneath it. Passed OK and I returned to the site to work out how to stick the numbers on a wet vehicle. No big sponsorship backing sheet despite the publicity stating that Land Rover had sponsored the RTV. More HBRO members streaming in with caravans, tents, trucks and trailers. The field tracks became a quagmire by late afternoon and wellies were essential wherever you went.

Saturday dawned dry and bright and the birds were singing instead of gargling but it was still rather squelchy underfoot. I was able to stick the competition numbers on instead of getting the hammer and nails out. The windows aren't big enough to block up with stickers and they won't stick too well to canvas. Incidentally, I think this is the first time I've actually stuck the numbers on the bodywork instead of displaying them in the windows since my very first National at Eastnor in a series IIa in 1986. At the RTV line-up, I was disappointed to find only one other 101 there. Where were you all, six-studders? His was standard so we weren't competing against each other anyway. The only embarrassment would have been to find him scoring less penalties at the end of the day. The sections were varied and interesting but the tightness of some of the turns and the width of some of the gates suggested that many had been laid out with an 80 with little consideration for anything bigger. There were at least three sections that included a turn that was quite impossible unless you had a shunt or you had a diff-lock equipped vehicle and were willing to risk using the hand-brake turn technique. A couple of 90's did try this but with two consecutive impossible gates on one of the sections, they gained only one or two points over their competitors. I was caught out a couple of times with inadequate power (how are you progressing with my new engine, James?). I stalled it once and on another occasion simply couldn't get up a hill due to lack of horses. The rest of the points were all just stupidity or because I wasn't in an 80. I did actually get one clear round - that was on a section requiring lots of axle travel but not needing much power. Just what the suspension was designed for. The day was very enjoyable and the atmosphere with the marshals and the other competitors was first class. The marshals did a grand job and I saw precious little if any argument. I got a disgraceful 72 points eventually (the other 101 scored 90 something.) At the end of the day, the removal of the sticky numbers revealed the original green paintwork - so that's why I always put the numbers in the windows! Quick paint-job needed when I get home.

It'll be a nice day to watch the CCVT tomorrow. WRONG. Pxxxxd down all night making a nonsense of a lot of the sections for Sunday. Paul Barton & Co put in a huge amount of work in the early hours of Sunday to revise some of the totally impossible sections but the level of difficulty was still quite high; up to "Major's Trial" standards in many cases. Well, it is the CCVT. Star attraction just had to be Malcolm Whitbread in his CCV / comp 101. He entered under the YROC banner though. Some people! He goes off up North, joins some other club and then comes South again to compete. I caught up with him as he was being towed out of a gully, the other side of which bore a perfect indentation of the front of a 101! The deep V-shaped gully had a slimy approach slope down from the 12 gate and was impassable; practically everyone taking a 10 here. Shame really as the rest of the section looked quite interesting but nobody got to drive it. Many other sections had equally impassable gates but usually these occurred far enough through the sections that everyone had an interesting day.

Monday was just as wet and some of the Comp Safari course had to be re-routed to make it useable. Pity really as some of the CCVT sections of the previous day were to have been woven into the course. No doubt as to who the star of the show was again. That Whitbread fellow. The coil-sprung 101 rides very well as a comp vehicle and he managed 16th overall at the end of the day. Many many red faces in the comp safari camp at being beaten by such an unlikely machine. Maybe he will start a trend.

Packed up my soggy tent on Monday afternoon and went home a bit early as I was due for an early start on Tuesday.

Clang of the weekend - Hugh Duffett and Neville Dewdney drive their vehicles down to the scrutineering queue and wait their turn. After scrutineering they have a bit of a chat and return to the camp site, still talking, in Neville's vehicle. Back at the site, Hugh looks around and says "Where's my Land Rover?" "Back at scrutineering, I expect says Neville" scarcely concealing a smile. Is that a Wally of the Year Award qualifying occurrence or what?!
