




Goodbye Pathfinder, Hallo Explorer.

No. I'm not talking about Nissan or Ford 4x4s, I'm talking about new maps. At a recent committee meeting, we decided that we needed to re-equip our set of 1:25000 scale maps of Hampshire and Berkshire. Currently, these are the familiar Pathfinders. 10 km wide by 5km North to South. Ordnance Survey are replacing these by two series of maps depending on the geographical area. In popular tourist / leisure areas, the yellow-coded "Outdoor Leisure" maps will take over with the orange "Explorer" series covering the rest of the country. These are not direct area-for-area replacements but seem to cover between 21/2 to 4 times the area of a Pathfinder series map. For example, Explorer 3 is "Chiltern Hills South" and exactly replaces four whole Pathfinder maps, 1137, 1138, 1156 and 1157. Explorer 17 "South Downs Way, Steyning to Newhaven" covers the Eastern edges of 1287 and 1306, all of 1288 and 1307 and the Western edges of 1289 and 1308. As each Explorer / Leisure map is produced, any Pathfinder maps that are completely covered will be withdrawn. The whole process is destined to take another 5 years.

Details of areas currently covered can be found in the Ordnance Survey "Mapping Index", ISBN 0-319-00888-6, and it's free!





A couple of friendly warnings for trials competitors: Firstly, keep those parts of your anatomy which you wish to minimise damaged to, inside the vehicle when trialling. Trees, bushes etc., will not move to avoid you, and you happen to make contact with a cane whilst traversing a section, will be regarded as vehicle contact!! Secondly, Tow Ropes; please do not leave Ropes in a wet condition wrapped around the bull bar or thrown into the back of the pick-up to weather the elements. Wash down after an event and allow to dry naturally. This will maximise their life, and allow you to inspect the rope for damage and wear. Remember a rope break in mid-pull can have serious consequences.

OK - Lecturing over - Happy Off-Roading in 1998 to you all !!!

Rule change proposals

As mentioned in my ARC meeting report last month, the the proposals submitted by Yorkshire and Lancs. & Ches. were looked at together as they covered essentially the same ground.

Basically, the proposal was this:-

Under certain special circumstances, it is helpful / necessary for the crew of a vehicle to swap roles for training / instructional purposes, or in events where it is of no consequence who drives and who is the passenger. The RACMSA Yearbook has a rule that allows the ARC to modify by an SR declaration. This rule states:-

H.11.3.1. The SRs may state that the persons comprising the vehicle crew at the start may be varied during the event.

The proposal is to add a rule to the ARC Handbook:-

D.4.3. In special circumstances, for certain events, ARC rules D.4.1. and D.4.2. may be superseded with the approval of the ARC Council with reference to regulation H.11.3.1. in the RACMSA Yearbook.

A club requiring this would need to write to the ARC Council explaining the circumstances and requesting this alleviation.

This was presented as the proposal and the original Yorkshire Rover Owners proposal and the Lancs. & Ches. proposal were withdrawn.

Please let me have your views on this (Yes or No) so I can vote on behalf of HBRO at the ARC AGM in March.

Letter from Oz

Dear Graham,

I have a free day (10 hour coach journey tonight) and access to this computer belonging to Tony's cousin so I have knocked up a quick letter for the HBRO magazine about the time spent here so far.

Tony and myself have been working here since September on the harvest. We are now with Tony's family in Melbourne before heading to Sydney for new year's eve as there is a big party in the warm sunshine on the beach!

We both had jobs with an agricultural contractor in central Queensland. We drove one of the four combines on a 12 hour shift, thus cutting continuously around the clock with the aim of cutting 400 acres in 24 hours with each combine. The farms ranged from 4000 acres to 14000 acres so we were at each for a while.

We have worked our way south to the Victorian border over 10 weeks. Travelling mostly on dirt roads for over 2500km. Some journeys took 2 days but all at 30 kph - a good speed to see the countryside!!!

As for Land Rovers here, there aren't many. In the cities the Discovery's are selling well and the new Range Rover for those that can afford them. We haven't seen any 90's at all. There have been quite a few 110 station wagons but more 130 Crew Cabs than 110 pickups. They buy chassis cabs and put their own flat body on the back.

The most popular 4X4 out of the cities are Toyotas by a long shot. This is because of the dealer networks and the simplicity of the vehicles. The Hi-Lux has a 2.8 litre diesel engine and the more popular Land Cruiser has a simple straight six 4.2 litre diesel which is very robust. Both vehicles mostly seen with a flat back instead of the standard rear body.

All other 4X4 makes and models are here also. Ford and GM have their badge on some of the Jap ones. There are some big American 4X4's which look good, all converted to RHD to be on the roads here. Mind you, so are the big trucks. IF you see a road train coming towards you on a gravel road it's always worth getting out of his way!!!

The Land Rover clubs have a good following here. I buy an Aussie Off Road magazine often to read about their exploits. Their RTV trials seem to be more demanding than ours!! It looks like there is going to be a good 50th anniversary rally next year on the East coast. We would have moved on by then but I wonder if Allan Tew is going to make the 3 day journey to attend?

I don't know who's vehicle this is but it's included as part of an experiment to see how easily I can start putting pictures back in the newsletter. You'll have seen last month's picture of the Lancaster Land Rovers Crew.

For the technical, the Lancaster photo was scanned and then converted from colour to a 256 grey-scale JPEG image using Paint Shop Pro. This adds about 250k to the Publisher file size. The one above was taken using a Sony digital camera and sent to me via e-mail by Graham Taylor. This too was converted to monochrome in the computer. It may look a bit "dotty" but that's about as fine as one dare go for a photocopied newsletter. Make the dots much finer and the image will smear in the copier when the toner goes through the fuser unit. (I warned you it would be technical!) Bear in mind that for various reasons, I still need to get the Publisher file on a floppy disc; that's one of the reasons I ditched the fancy tyre-tracks cover art which took up too much disc space!

The other way to place pictures in the newsletter is to photocopy them and manually paste them in. So by the time the newsletter is printed from the resulting artwork, the picture is "second-generation" copy-of-a-copy and will lose quality. Please let me know if the quality is OK or if you have experience of doing things differently.
