





ARC AGM 99

This report is produced from notes taken at the time and the numbers are from the agenda. Sometimes they are combined or not dealt with at the time so some numbers are missing. I am actively involved in many matters under discussion so this report is not guaranteed to be free from bias!

- 4) Matters arising from previous minutes:-
- Send samples of club logos to ARC sec for review. This to include the oval, zig-zag, Viking ship or head etc.
- The Scrutineering Committee objected to the reduction in pre-meeting time.
 This time was intended to be for Rights of Way, Club Shops, Car Clubs,
 Scrutineering Committee etc. etc. Only the Scrutineering Committee made use of this time but is the one to suffer from the reduction of allocated time.
- The Fuel Injection issue was raised. Peter Oakden (PO) stated that the Policy Document had been accepted by the membership on 15th June 1996. The Fuel Injection proposals had been vetoed as they conflicted with that policy document, in particular where it states that extremism will be curtailed. PO stated that the new regulations coming along would provide the opportunity to allow petrol injection in modified vehicles. Colin Council asked why petrol injection is considered to be extreme now but not at some time in the future. The main objection to the vetoing of the proposals was that only the Scrutineering Committee has the power of veto. Nowhere is it stated that the Council have such powers. PO stated that Dave Marsh had reported to the October 98 Council that the Scrutineering Committee had decided that these proposals should be dropped. However, the Scrutineering Committee had not met to discuss these proposals at this point in time and so Dave Marsh did not have the mandate from the Scrutineering Committee to make such a statement. His statement should therefore be treated as his own views, and not those of the committee.
- Colin Council asked about the General Regulations of the ARC. Andy Stavordale stated that some time ago he had started to trawl through the last ten years of minutes to find appropriate matters that would constitute such regulations. He will continue with this time permitting. These should not be confused with the Constitution itself.
- 5) Chairman's Report Peter Oakden.
- Previous Secretary John Bradbury left the post at short notice and Caroline Flanders took the post and is now getting up to speed. Quantities of documentation is still to be sorted.
- The Town and Country festival was great success and the ARC will be there again in 99. The heritage run will also be run again as it is intended to be an annual event.

- Two members of the ARC Council will be leaving this time round. Jim Campbell has been the Caravan Secretary for 17 years. Geof Miller has been around the Rover scene for over 40 years both at the factory and in the ARC. His ambition was to get ARC News out to every single member and he is very close to this now.
- Peter expressed his thanks top Debbie Aldridge for taking the minutes of the meetings. He also thanked the Scrutineering Committee for their work through the current turbulent times.
- Peter also asked for a team to enter the Channel 4 programme "Scrap Heap" in which the team will make something that works from a pile of scrap.
- 6) Secretary's Report. Caroline Flanders.
- CF began the task in Nov 98. Most of the files arrived at the December meeting and continue to arrive from various sources!
- Post now comes via a PO box.
- Caroline thanked JB for his work on the 1998 Rally.
- Peak & Dukeries wrote in to raise a formal objection to the vetoing of the Petrol Injection proposals.
- 7) Treasurer. Andrew Stavordale.
- Annual accounts available to all clubs. (So I won't go into much detail in this report - Steve).
- ARC RoW fighting fund. Funds for worthy causes relating to Rights of Way and Land Access issues. £1836 income in 1998.
- 1998 Rally account. About £2½k profit so far. Still some invoices and bills to be finalised. Reports from locals gave the ARC credit for the site being left in a good state.
- The ARC raffle was not a great success because not as many tickets were sold as was predicted. 250,000 tickets were printed but only 14,500 sold. However, the ARC has donated £3000 for the restoration of Eastnor Church as promised. Thanks go to Sue and Ian Foster for arranging and managing the raffle and also for moving the prize Discovery vehicle around.
- The CCMSA has a very low turnover. It provides RTA exemption permits.
 We have to pay the annual Companies House registration but there won't be any Corporation Tax unless we change the nature of the business.
- ARC Accounts. Sets provided at the AGM are the full set and are available to all clubs. There are 5,234 competitive members and there is a slight reduction of member numbers. The RAC Recovery commission brings in £1500 from 200 renewals.
- There are currently 909 vehicles log-booked.
- Auditors. Michael Rudd & Co have served the ARC well and AJS proposed that we continue with them. Their annual fee is £500 which is a good deal.
- Club Subscriptions. 17 clubs still haven't paid their 1999 subs. This included 8 UK clubs.
 - Membership fees charging methods. Voting forms were received from all

but 6 UK clubs. There was 1 abstention but the voting for the three proposals was 10, 8 and 11 respectively. This is a very close race but the decision was to go with proposal 3 which basically charges a *per capita* fee for each member depending on what they do. Fees will be:- Administration 55p per member for all clubs. Land Rover clubs have an additional 55p per member fee to cover Countryside Access. Then each club member who competes in events will be charged £1.75 each which buys them a Competition Pack consisting of a Competitor's Card and Handbook. (This will be the new-look ARC Handbook which will contain administration and vehicle regulations.) There will be a vote at the June EGM to accept this for implementation in 2000.

- 8) Election of Officials and other voting results.
- Council members Jim Campbell, caravan secretary is being replaced by Chris Hodson of the Range Rover Register. Geof Miller, Press, Publicity & Sponsorship and ARC News is handing over to Nick Chinery (Series 1 Club) for Press, Publicity & Sponsorship, with Paul Barton (HBRO / SROC) taking on ARC News.
- Scrutineering Committee Denis Chamberlain stands down and Ray Sykes moves in.

10a) Caravans - Jim Campbell.

- Been involved in Rover clubs for 27 years. Started NERO which was cars only at the beginning. Never occurred to him that anyone would want to play with Land Rovers!
- Caravan Secretary from 1982 to 1999. Total of 2134 permits issued in that time.
- STILL duff applications come in!! He showed an example which had no SAE for the reply, the location of the site was not stated, and the land-owner's consent had been signed by the Competition Secretary!
- Be careful what you organise on a rally if you arrange bus-trips or visits to local venues, this could be construed as being a package holiday which is not covered by the permit!

10b) International Liaison. Derek Spooner.

- There are 14 overseas clubs and many attended the 1998 Rally.
- Another Italian club wishes to join the ARC and enthusiasts in Thailand also want to join in.
- The internet is a good medium for communication. He suggested a common address for council members to be on the internet.

10c) Non Competitive Clubs Co-ordinator. Chris Savidge.

 Chris highlighted the continuing of the Heritage Run and the All Rover Weekend at the Royal Show at Stoneleigh. The heritage run will start at the Lode Lane entrance of the factory and end at Gaydon. Date - May 2nd.

- There will be a Land Rover Concours d'Élégance at the YROC National Rally this year. Trophies will be awarded to classes based on national clubs i.e. S1, S2, RR, Lightweight, 101. There will also be an award for any Land Rover, not covered by these, that is a real everyday working vehicle. Trophies have been donated by Dunsfold Land Rovers, Jill Floyd, Frank Myatt, Bonnie & Chris Savidge, and a Land Rover dealer in Nottingham.
- The All Rover Weekend will again be at the Royal Show at Stoneleigh on August Bank Holiday. Special feature this year will involve the Discovery which is 10 years old this year and this should be celebrated. Does anyone out there own a G-xxx-WAC registered Disco? If so, we want your vehicle for the show. Contact John Cakewell or Chris Savidge. We also need vintage Land Rovers with working accessories which can be demonstrated at the show.

10d) Land Access. Tony Kempster.

- LARA conferences for 1999 are still in the planning process. What do we need to cover.
- TK has contacted the editor of the CLA magazine which carried an article entitled "4x4 Threat". The article stated that vehicles should use private 4x4 courses.
- The Environment minister will soon announce details on the "Right to Roam" principle requested by the RA. Land owners will be allowed to close land to the public for 28 days each year.
- New publication now out "Health & Safety at Motorsports Events" this is for smaller events. Price is £10 but there is a 45% discount for a bulk purchase (100).LARA could buy 100 and supply them to its member clubs. ARC is one.
- 1999 Green Lane Day is on March 28th.

10e) National Rallies

- 1999. Site opens at noon on Friday and closes at noon on Tuesday. Acknowledgements to applications will be sent out after Easter. Food and drink on site will be at normal shop prices. Marshals needed for the off-road drive. Please contact Dave Barker on 01423-734412.
- Harold Carman raised some issues of vehicle regulations as there seemed
 to be some confusion at the recently held event that YROC hosted. This
 was not an ARC event although there still seems to be some confusion
 about legacy roll-bar designs. These are no longer permitted as far as the
 MSA Yearbook is concerned but they are satisfactorily covered by their
 ARC log- books. YROC reps confirmed that they would be running to the
 provisions of the ARC Handbook.
- 2000. Dave Cuthbert reported on this as the HBRO rep. Site is looking good but not yet confirmed. (it is now!). HBRO are looking for ancillary activities. BAMA is to involved as is military assistance.
- 10f) ARC Handbook. Steve Kirby.

 Steve explained the reasons behind the delay in publication and thanked Tony Holder for pulling out the stops to get the book printed. It is recognised that in future, the Handbook will take on a different purpose.

10g) Press, Publicity and Sponsorship Geoff Miller.

- 11 years ago, Geof took early retirement from Land Rover Ltd.
- · ARC News circulation is currently around 10250.
- There is still too much "Us & Them" syndrome in the ARC. The members, you and me, ARE the ARC.
- ARC News should be for democratic communications of news, comments and thanks.
- The Tyro, Novice and Showroom vehicle trials are progressing.
- News 25 just delivered after a delay, News 26 due very soon.
- Thanks to Andrew Neaves for keeping the database up to date.
- Still getting returns from dud addresses. Clubs are not informing him of moves and retirements. Some discontinued members are still receiving copies.
- The contents of all ARC News's are on the internet at ARC.RRR.CO.UK

10h) Rover Company Liaison. Peter Oakden.

- Rover Group are being re-organised and management duplications being removed.
- Logos. Send what you intend to use via Caroline Flanders.
- Factory visits seem to be cancelled until further notice. Graham Cheery and Molly Maine are the staff to contact for visits. Comment from the floor seems to indicate that factory visits will be arranged through dealerships.

10j) Shows & Displays. June & Jack Green.

- Exhibition unit is being refurbished at a cost of about £1500. It worth £5k at
 the moment but in prime condition could be worth another £3k so the
 expenditure is well worth it. These trailers are £20k+ new.
- Photos and other material wanted for display purposes. Green Lane trips, Competitions, Working parties etc.

10k) Scrutineering Committee.

- Steve Kirby read out Dave Marsh's report. The key points were:-
 - Some competitors are extremely selective in the rules they choose to read in the yearbook. This is coupled with an unwillingness to consult the Scrutineering Committee on controversial interpretations. This should not be tolerated as it is not fair to the majority who compete. The Scrutineering Committee has a commitment to ensure fair interpretation of the rules for all and any competitor who has a question regarding interpretation, should write to us.
 - Production Standard Regs.
 - We are open to any observation on these and would implore all clubs

- to run these and gain feedback from the membership.
- We have concerns regarding their use with leaf sprung vehicles.
 Perhaps these could retain the old rules. If the rules are too complicated, people will not use them.
- Modified Production Standard Regs are now being reviewed with a view to publishing them in 2000. These should be used extensively before changing the current Special Class regs.
- Fuel injection. We will promote its use in both the Standard and the forthcoming Modified Production Regs.

- Fire extinguishers. Problems with AFFF is due to be resolved soon following test by the Standards Institute.
- Thanks to the committee for all their work this last year.
- Steve commented on the poor attendances at Scrutineering Group meetings and showed that 6 or 7 clubs had never sent a rep. Only the Shetland Club was excused! "Are all the competitive clubs aware that they can send a rep?" Steve asked.

- MSA Club Bulletin. New wording for membership cards. This info is not in the 1999 Blue Book.
- A new fire extinguisher gas is being tested. It looks promising, so don't buy a AFFF replacement yet.





5. COUNTRYSIDE ACCESS.

5.1 Tony Kempster, ARC Countryside Access Officer, needs your help as follows: "Green road use evidence required for two routes in Wales.

This is your chance to come forward with vehicle user evidence for two well-known routes in mid-Wales. The first is a RUPP south east of Machynlleth for which Powys County Council has made an order reclassifying it as bridleway. The route in question links the ends of two county roads, one running south from Machynlleth which terminates at GR 784908, and one running north from Ponterwyd in Ceredigion which terminates at the county boundary at GR 783892 (1:50,000 OS sheet 135). An objection was lodged, and anyone with either documentary or user evidence should let me know ASAP. Together with statements from local people who are prepared to say that they used the route with horses and carts prior to 1930, any additional evidence could well result in byway status for this important route.

The other route is a RUPP between GR 812975 and GR 837960 (also on sheet 135), for which an order has been made reclassifying it as a byway. However, many objections have been lodged and a public enquiry is likely. Vehicular user evidence is therefore required to support byway status. Again, please let me know of any user evidence you may have.

National TRO Register.

I suggested to the last LARA meeting that a national register of TROs affecting green roads, could prove a useful reference base. The idea was accepted, and I agreed that the ARC would try to collate what information was available within the clubs. So I would be pleased if anyone out there can let me have details of TROs in their area."

6. IN MEMORIAM.

I have received a letter from Geoff Fuller, which is reproduced below, in full, "On Thursday 26th. November 1998, an Inquest took place into the death of a close friend, and fellow member of the Association Of Rover Clubs, Dave Martin, and of his son Matthew

Dave enjoyed a number of years as a member of Staffs and Shrops Rover Owners Club. He was involved with the Club magazine 'Tale Gate', and then became the Competition Secretary. He joined in everything, FVTs, RTVs, Competitive Safaris, Green Laning, and was very active throughout the 1988 National, and the 40th. Anniversary of Land Rover at Trentham. He was responsible for the Special Driving Sequences on the official video, and his was the camera vehicle. He went on to join the All Wheel Drive Club, and more recently the Newcastle and Nantwich Rover Owners Club, where he also left his mark. His son Matthew, who was known to only a few of us, was sixteen, and was his father's son—cheeky-charming- and full of life.

On the 24th April 1998 their Land Rover left the road on a downhill right hand bend, and collided with a stone retaining wall. At the inquest, the reports were graphically detailed, and every aspect had been covered. The Police reported that, on inspection, the front nearside track rod end was found to be detached from the drag link tube. A strip down revealed all other components to be in good working order. Eye witnesses confirmed that the vehicle was not travelling fast. Dave's blood alcohol test was clear. They concluded that corrosion inside the drag link tube caused the components to part, during heavy steering, rendering the steering inoperative. The corrosion would not have been evident at the MOT test three weeks earlier. Verdicts of accidental death were recorded on both Dave and Matthew.

The Coroner requested that, through the organisations that Dave was associated with, as many people as possible be made aware of the hidden danger of concealed corrosion within aged components. Renewal of the tube(s) on an old vehicle was recommended.

Dave and Matt are very much missed by many, our deepest sympathy goes out to those left behind, especially Carol, wife and mother, and Dave's close sister Mandy."

Perhaps the most fitting memorial we can achieve to Dave and Matthew's memory, is that we prevent such an accident ever happening again, so please take special note of the Coroner's request in the penultimate paragraph of Geoff's letter.

Scrutineering News

During the last Scrutineering Group meeting, many topics were discussed and a number of conclusions and decisions was reached. Not all of these will affect HBRO members.

Vents / scoops / other holes in bonnets.

MSA rule H.22.2.1. states "Unless a rear-engined Off-Road vehicle, have a bonnet or metal casing, of solid non-inflammable material covering and/or surrounding the engine, which is secured by fasteners of adequate strength and having a positive locking action."

This means what it says and so scoops, louvres etc are not permitted in the bonnet.

2. Comp Safari course marking:-

- > Markers should be red on the front and black on the back so a disoriented driver can see if he is going the wrong way on the course.
- > Course markers should be visible one from the other. That is, as you pass one, you should be able to see the next.
- > Mark hazards well in advance. If it's a major hazard, mark it twice at different distances unless a distance marker is used.
- > Corners mark with tape around the corner.
- > Natural tracks still need markers to confirm route.

Unacceptable crash helmets.

Scrutineers may remove the MSA approval label from a helmet in order to prevent its use for competition. They may confiscate the helmet for the duration of the event and then return it. The MSA sticker will be be applied when a helmet on the basis of the presence of the blue British Standards (BS) sticker on the back and the manufacturer's stitched-in label inside. The BS sticker is easily worn off and the pre-event scrutineer might feel that the helmet is not acceptable when this label is absent. Strictly speaking, he is entitled to reject the helmet. However, at a recent Scrutineering Seminar, the MSA suggested that the scrutineer uses a bit of common sense and conclude that where the MSA sticker and the stitched-in one are both intact, then the helmet is acceptable. Helmet buyers should consider sticking a patch of clear vinyl or similar over the paper BS sticker to preserve it and when not in use, the helmet should be stored in a box or a bag.

4. Roof mounted spare wheels

This mounting position should be discouraged.

- Internal cab area safety
 Check for overlong bolts etc. used for attaching items mounted on the roof.
 These could cause a hazard in the cab.
- 6. Windscreen glass. Types to be used in RTVs or CCVs:Ideally, windscreen glass should be laminated, safety-glass or 4mm
 Perspex (or equivalent) How do you check? Laminated glass can be
 detected by tapping with a small coin. Laminated glass will yield a dull
 knock whereas ordinary and safety glass will sound a sharp tap. The heat
 treatment stresses can usually be seen in safety-glass when viewed with
 polarised sun-glasses. So if it yields a sharp tap but doesn't have heat
 treatment stresses, then its probably ordinary glass.
- Front hoop mounts.

Mounting method in Q.7.8. of the ARC Roll-cage Regulations shows one bolt attaching the bulkhead and the front hoop at the same time. Scrutineers might like to check that the bolt is high tensile.

8. Front hoop mounts on bulkhead.

The fact that a vehicle is log-booked doesn't mean that the scrutineers should stop looking at the roll-cage **and its mountings**. This includes particular attention being paid to the bulkhead where this supports the front hoop. So it is still down to the scrutineer to determine that the vehicle appears to be safe.

High Tensile bolts.

Attention is drawn to the use of high tensile nuts and bolts being used to attach recovery fittings and roll-cages. See the ARC Handbook for details on bolt head markings. Please do report any errors in this information. Scrutineers shouldn't take any nonsense from drivers even when they are close friends, you have the right to check. It's your signature on the document! Note too that if the front tow-point is attached to the front bumper, then the bumper must be secured to the chassis with HT bolts too. The ARC Handbook states this but this problem still appears occasionally.

Use of petrol injectors in Specials.
 It is not permissible to supply fuel to a petrol engine through an injector for any reason on a Special Class vehicle.


