

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

Between making a winch bumper for a RR Bobtail and my EFI probs, I did take a "Day Out" and went to the Challenger 4x4 Open Day, to celebrate the 1st Anniversary of them in their new premises, and also (actually if the truth known the main reason!) was to have a go on their newly built "Twist Off Ramp".

Ed was due to come with me, but I had a early morning call from him - he had gone down with Flu and was going nowhere, the idea of being jiggled about and shoved up at silly angles all day in a noisy 280BHP 90 V8 seemed not to appeal to him for some reasonPah No stamina...

In simple terms think of this as a "Cross Axle" tester. LRs in their standard form are fairly good out of the box, but cross axles can easily defeat standard suspensions. Cross axle 'diff locks' help, but a combo of suspension mods, and say a pair of ARBs transforms your 4x4 into something far far more capable.

A twist off ramp cuts through all the nonsense often spoken by many about ludicrous claims on this and that, and just twists the axles and shuts up the dreamers..... Once a wheel – any wheel – has "lifted" off the ground, then that's your lot, and a measurement is taken. Paul screamed at me to stop when later in the day I tried to beat my initial scores, he said I was running out of ramp, I told him I was running out of nerves! – it's truly terrifying up there!

The ramp (or RTI Ramp to give it is proper name) is made to an exacting specification I think it's a 20 degree angle, then the "Victim" drives the drivers front wheel as high up the ramp as they can go, until a wheel breaks free, then a reading is taken. This reading is only a base reading, the wheelbase of the 4x4 has an effect too, the longer the wheelbase the easier the ramp becomes, and a shorter wheelbase more tricky, so this is factored in. Years ago 1000 RTI score was deemed about perfect, since then this with special kit can and has been exceeded, but it is for most still a "Magic Figure" to aim at and this will give a

massive amount of movement, std LRs are around the 400 mark, and some quite tricked up bits of kit can be shocked when they find that the kit they have is actually not quite as good as they thought.





Many think that adding lift helps flex, er, no not really, it's a combination of spring poundages (and many 2" lifts are done via HD springs - so that makes flexing even worse!) shocks, mountings, bushings, and generally how much the suspension will flex before locking itself up. Last Month the X Eng article showed their new Rear Arms and spring systems, well thought out and not overly much money for what you get, believe me DIYing it can prove very expensive in time.... if not in parts that are then replaced with plans B C D & E.....don't ask me how I know!!

As such I was desperate to see if my homemade DIY changes worked...

First you go up the ramp, and have a measure taken, then in reverse shoving the passenger rear tyre on the ramp. It is a spooky experience, having no idea where you are with daylight everywhere, but at a horrendous angle! But all there enjoyed the hospitality of Paul & Lucy, many had a go up the ramp, even Freelanders, and the shriek from Lucy when she stopped only some 12 inches onto the ramp reduced all around to hysterics!

Coffee buns, choc cake, and tea were in abundance, the weather was not too bad but it was all done in the Challenger 4x4 workshops, and people came and went all day. Dave from Keith Gotts turned up for a go in his modified Disco, and left chuffed with some ideas for maybe next year, and this is the key, many have mentioned to Paul & Lucy what a great day it was, and how about a yearly "Twist Off" day?....we will see...sounds good to me

Anyway at the end of the day the scores were worked out, I came in with 934 Rear 913 Front and that meant not only was I happy with me suspension mods – but I won, front on rear on and overall

Grasping my prize I set off home, I hadn't walked through the door before I had a phone call re some fab work someone wants doing - just how do I get <u>me own</u> stuff done?......

You will have seen last month an advert from HBRO Member selling his beloved Disco, well, I had a note off him, advising he has started his new project and will be around and about and out with us all in the not too distant future, pics further in the mag with his letter in Pants and Berks.

Oh, and that's about it from me this month, there's some more on the HBROs Mike Wolfe Winch Challenge Event, and this will be possibly the last poke to wake up those who want to be involved....... but as yet have to action themselves,

MARSHALS RING ME! and note your interest and involvement, this is NOT a turn up on the day and offer your services as a marshal, you MUST advise us up front.

We are now nearing the 40x teams of 24x4s!, that's one hell of an entry field, and we will make this an event to remember - and for all the right reasons,

Lee Claydon set out a great little gymkhana on the Saturday and Ian Smart ran an exemplary TYRO on Easter Monday. The driving day sadly had limited attendance with only 4 members turning up.

So, what else is there from "Moi"?



This site is a combination of gravel and clay so one you dig down there is loads of grip. However the cunning land owner Lee has dug out some areas to form troughs and mounds to make the terrain more interesting. This gave us scope to set out wide gates and let the ground condition make the sections harder to drive.



Whilst setting out section 3 Richard dropped us down a small bank into an innocuous looking muddy hole. That'll be where we stopped then, suspended in our seat belts. Luckily Nick Jennings had just turned up to rescue us. Thanks Nick. A carefully considered winch pull soon had us back or 'terror firmer'.

So we replanned the route slightly, within 3 minutes of being rescued we were perched with our front wheels airboure going nowhere again. A slightly springing recovery tape soon had us out of that one thanks again to Nick.



Eventually we managed to set out 7 sections for the trial.

Early start Sunday morning and we were all ready for the trailers. Richard checkout out the sections, Angela, got the paperwork ready and I scrutinized the motors. There were 16 entrants two of which were CCV motors driven by Mark A and Mark F.

Section 1 caused a few head aches with its cunning combination of cross axles twisters and turns. No clears here. Section 2 saw Hugh fail at gate 6 unable to climb the bank. Unusual for Hugh, who was soon to retire with drive problems. Gary White was pushing for a clear on this section but decided on the short route to the finish which cost him 3 points.



It was interesting to see the increasing number of Discos out this weekend, they are definitely becoming a cheaper option for trialing.

Section 3 had some water, slightly deeper water. V8s beware, all except Russell V who drowned his in the deepest section; twice. Dave Osbourne was in great control of his white Disco but still managed to tweak the 7 gate.

The last section before lunch was an uphill muddy struggle, only the two CCV motors making it clear.

After lunch, there was a short section with an up hill start. It was one of those sections that had not been driven by a long wheel base, so they all got stuck going across the ditch. Well not all Mike Fitzgerald had to be towed out of the ditch on the start line first; and then out of the ditch on the section. The next two sections went without too much drama, except for Gary White taking an 11 on the last section. Bert recovered all 5 long wheel bases on this section.

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


Then it's back off-road! Keep up the good work on the mag.

'ARC' & 'NON ARC' class 4x4s MUST have the following :

ALL Entrants Vehicles MUST be fully road legal & display the 4x4s Valid Road Tax Disc Body Style: Hard Top, Truck Cab. & Soft Tops are allowed (Soft-Top MUST have Rear Roll Cage). 4x4 Tyres - Must be Road Legal. NO CHAINS ALLOWED ON TYRES Seat Belts or Full Harness Belts (Must be worn when 4x4 is moving). Winches, Electric, Mechanical, Hydraulic, or Tirfor don't care - all are allowed Winching Gloves - MANDATORYEVEN with PLASMA Winching 'Sail' - MANDATORY and a Minimum of 1 Fire Extinguisher per Team All Loose equipment must be safely stored on board at all times. No loose items in the Crew Cab area

'Suitable' FRONT & REAR Recovery Points These are NOT SUITABLE:

ANY Towballs welded to Chassis Bumpers or Rear Crossmembers, ANY Bolts used to connect recovery points are not Marked at 8.8T or higher, ANY bolts DON'T EXTEND FULLY throughout the nut by min 2 threads, ANY Recovery Points not fitted with suitable Spreader Plates on opposite size of Point, Chassis showing heavy signs of rust with holes or crumbling / rot & we consider unsuitable. ANY Winch wire ropes frayed spiked, damaged kinked, or untested junk, ANY Alcohol at ANY time - (immediate removal from site of team)

'ARC' & 'NON ARC' Classes CAN have the following:

High Lift Jack(s), extra winch cable extensions, spades, shovels, Spare wheel(s) & Toolkit(s), spares carried on board on with you or at your base BUT - NO back up crews allowed !....

Fire Extinguisher(s) & 1st Aid Kits, torches etc but NO MATCHES or Lighters ! Winch Equipment, Extra Gloves, Shackles, Tree Strops, Ground Anchors etc. CB Radio / PMRs Vehicle based or / and hand helds. Tow Ropes (NOT KERRs) Roll Over Bars, Cages SideBars, etc etc etc

'NON ARC' ONLY CAN have the following additional items:

Locking Differentials, ARBs, KAMs, Detroit, LSDs TSDs Etc Oversize Tyres i.e. 35" Simex, 40" Boggers modified Body Silhouettes etc Non Land Rover / Odd engine configurations, e.g. Suzuki, Perkins in a Bobtail RR etcAlmost any Mod,if in doubt ask !....



ARC' ONLY MUST abide to the following:

Scrutineering to the 'ARC' Rules and Club Handbook. Failure to Pass on the above will mean designation to 'NON ARC' Class or expulsion.

BOTH 'ARC' & 'NON ARC' CANNOT have ANY the following :

Tyre Chains, Studded tyres, Any type of Winching Chains ANY Damaged or frayed Tow Ropes, Winch Cables or Strops. (you will fail Scrutineering) Chain Saws or other Saws - (Officials only) ANY untested shackles or rated at LESS THAN 4.75T
