## Social Events - Have your say



## Your Club Needs You


We really do need you to turn out and help to marshal at our events. On the RTV front things are looking up and we seem to be running in the order of 20+ competitors at each trial.




If we have enough marshals to split the entry into two groups,

## Green Laning Trip 9th November 2008

"Dodgy Disco Downs Doughty Defender" by Sean Comber

After last month's green laning trip around north Hampshire I foolishly said I'd be happy to plan and lead the November trip out. Having volunteered I spent several evenings poring over my Anquet map program trying to find a route with some interesting lanes I knew, with plenty of new ones I fancied trying for the first time. On top of that I wanted to take in some of the more interesting/challenging lanes we had driven before. My first attempt produced a route covering most of Hants, Berks and Wilts and added up to over 100 miles, too far for one day. I was desperately trying to maximise off-tarmac time, particularly with the clocks going back now restricting daylight hours. Eventually after a few evenings of playing with routes I came up with a run starting at Ludgershall just outside Andover and taking a clock-wise arc touching on Salisbury Plain, up over the Vale of Pewsey, skirting south of Marlborough then heading south back to where we started. Having got the OK from Julian and checking the council websites for TRO's etc, the day was planned.

Sunday morning dawned fairly bright and, most importantly dry. We trundled down the M4, A34 and A30 to Ludgershall and met the rest of the party in the entrance to the first lane. The group was slightly on the large side, 2 Discovery's - ours and Mike's 300 TDI auto now shod with mud tyres and still sporting the monstrous light bar on the roof and determined to have another go at scraping it off after October's impressive efforts. The 2 Discos were accompanied by 5 'proper' Land Rovers, Julian's 90, a military spec 110 driven by Richard and Peter, a modified 90 driven by Simon, a modified 110 driven by Mark and Nicks 90. Once everyone had made their introductions were saddled up and ran down the first lane linking the A346 and A342. Crossing the road we squelched through a farm covered in a combination of mud, straw and dung - nice. What was worse was that Mac was driving our Disco out front and I had to get out and unhook/hook an interminable number of electric fences across the lane. The lane ran round the back of Sidbury Hill an old iron-age fort. Being on the edge of Salisbury Plain meant that Byways were running everywhere and with only my printed out map to follow, I was struggling for bearings on a fairly featureless landscape. After missing yet another turn and shuttling between ours and Mikes Disco where he had a fully loaded GPS and laptop set up, I at least could see where I was going wrong. To improve matters we gave Mike and Jason one of our short wave radios so at least I could avoid getting out to find out where we were.



It was only a bit later when looking in everyone else's cabs did it dawn on me that here was us leading with a map stuck together from numerous A4 sheets when everyone else had GPS and PC/Pocket PC set ups.... Doh! No wonder everyone looked so smug as I was scratching my head! Anyway we passed Sidbury Hill covered in lots of other Land Rovers all competing in a AWDC Comp Safari, so there was some pretty impressive looking kit there. We got a few odd looks as we trundled past heading towards the Old Marlborough Road which provided an easy run north for a few miles. From there we passed down a couple more easy lanes around Hog Down, with me at least being able to map read clearer with less tracks and more features. A byway

towards Milton Lilbourne on the edge of the Vale of Pewsey provided a bit of muddy entertainment and the ruts caused us to lock the diff as our around clearance became marginal, something which was not going to be a problem for the Defenders obviously. The Discos came through with flying colours though and we moved on into the Vale of Pewsey, through Manningford Bourne and back up onto the ridge looking for a byway I've driven before which was very good fun. After a missed turn we hit upon it and apparently it is called "the steps" which was self explanatory when you get half way down a fairly innocuous looking lane only to be confronted with a series of greasy sill and diff-bashing steps. However, with a bit of momentum, too much according to Mac, and gravity to aid us we bumped down over with only a few scary metallic sounding crunches. It is in lanes like those that you realise what fantastic machines Land Rovers are. At that point we broke for lunch at a pub in Marden. It was a relief to get out of our Land Rover as Mac had let Alfie, his dog, out earlier who proceeded to roll in fox cack and absolutely stank. The pub was a bit of a 'gastro-pub' which meant small potions but big cost, but the ploughman's and hotpot were very edible.

After lunch we covered a few road miles up to a very pleasant lane leading from the top of Knap Hill towards East Kennet, giving a lovely view of Silbury Hill in the distance. This marked the most northern extent of our drive and from there we headed east through a gorgeous beech wood showing off its radiant autumnal colours. On through Easton Royal and we climbed up out of the Vale of Pewsey once more into a fairly innocuous looking lane skirting round Crowdown Clump. Nearing the end of the lane, everything went wrong.......

The last 100 or so yards were a bit of a quagmire, mud and water sloughed off the rolling chalk down land. It was around 3pm and already the sky was darkening (ominously) and the wind was whipping up the valley. The disco came to a halt and Mac declared that we were grounded. We all got out and surveyed the situation. Two options presented themselves, pull out onto the edge of the field and skirt the worst of the goo or floor it get as far as we can then get towed through the rest, which only extended a few 10's of yards before recovering to hardstanding once more. Coincidently, two other Land Rovers approaching from the other direction, took one look and drove the other way.....

Anyway full of hubris and having a safety net of supporting Land Rovers with winches, waffle boards, tow ropes etc etc I took the 'floor it' option and drove/skidded on the steering guard around half way through the mud, then stopped. At this point the others decided to haul out and skirt the field. Julian nipped around and backed up to tow me out. Having attached a strop to the towing eye of the guard the Disco was unceremoniously yanked yard by yard through the morass. The fact that every yank moved us a few yards provided both myself and Julian confidence in keeping going. Unfortunately we were to pay for this hubris. The smoke I could see coming from Julian's 90 was not from the tyres creating friction in the ruts but was in fact a cooking clutch. With safety but a few yards away, Julian lost all drive and the jig was up. Julian was winched out followed by us and we surveyed the situation. The only course of action was to tow Julian out and get his recovery people to pick him up. We towed him the mile or so into Everleigh and the tow truck was set to arrive within the hour.

By this time it was almost dark and raining hard, so we decided to call it a day, said our goodbyes and went our separate ways, our Disco with its tail between its legs. Next time I promise we'll tow Julian out........

#### So lessons learnt:

- Use the tricked up Land Rovers for recovery not the ones with AT tyres and a rope.
- An extra inch or so really does make the difference, Mac and my procrastination regarding a 2 inch lift and bigger tyres really needs to proceed beyond chatting about it and looking on Ebay. Fantasy needs to become reality.

The event insurance covers those members setting up the event and is there for your benefit; but it is valid only if you sign to say that you are there.
- Please help to marshal the event. Attend the marshals briefing and then ask
  an experienced marshal for guidance on how to score and how to assist in
  the safe running of the event. We'll show you how to score if you've not done
  it before. A Marshalling Guide booklet is available on request.
- If you are interested in scrutineering, please ask to accompany one of the scrutineers on the day. They'll show you how the checks are done and what to look for. A Scrutineering Guide booklet is available on request.


